The name Kenneth Leonard Carter doesn't necessarily strike fear into the hearts of defenders.

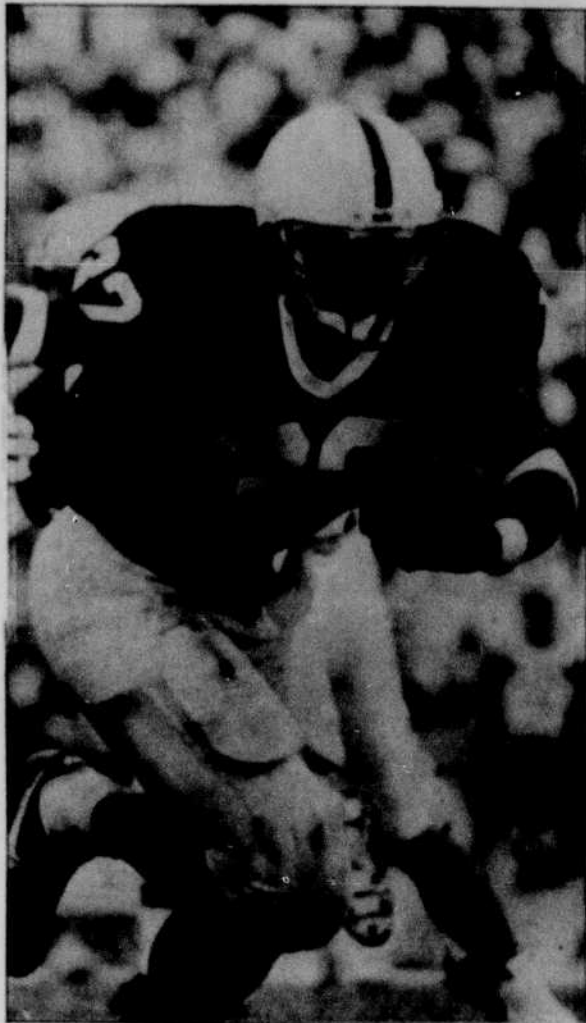
But just mention the nickname "Ki-Jana" around a defensive player and watch his eyes light up with instant recognition.
