(8) and net receiving yards (474) on only 32 receptions.

As McLemore is quick to point out, those statistics are meager when you compare them to what the California native did when healthy last season. In 1993, he caught 50 balls for 791 yards, a near 16-yard average, and hauled in 10 touchdown passes to tie Bobby Moore's school record.

But the Oregon career leader in touchdown receptions (19) still has that air about him that ensures others that he will get the job done.

"I hear that a lot," McLemore said about the sense that he exudes. "It makes me feel good to have somebody feel that way and to have that much confidence in me and my abilities. I like to be in the spotlight."

"I think a lot of people anticipate that something positive is going to happen when I'm on the field and that's good because it shows that I've been doing my job. The special part of it for me is how much fun it can be to have that success."

Besides his own injuries, McLemore was faced with the career-ending injury to one

of his closest friends on the team, junior split end Kory Murphy, after the second game of the 1994 season.

"That was a tough situation," McLemore said about Murphy's injury and his decision to wear Murphy's uniform number this season. "At that point in time I had to make a decision on what I was going to do as far as stepping up in his place. Just taking his number was just a little bit of it by helping people remember him and letting them know that he's still with us."

"When Kris decided to do that," Murphy said, "it just really showed me that he is a true friend. He and I have been through everything and I'm just thankful that one of us is really succeeding."

McLemore's numbers may be lower this season, but make no mistake, he is healthy again and is a potent weapon in the Oregon offense heading to Pasadena for the Rose Bowl and a chance to knock off the highly touted Nittany Lions.

"I think (Penn State) is going to have to really try to man our receivers up," junior tailback Ricky Whittle said, "and that's where they're in trouble. You can't man people up like Cristin McLemore with his great routes."

ing him is going to be a challenge."

"Quite a running back" is an understatement when you talk about a man who should finish among the top four in the Heisman Trophy balloting after an outstanding 1994 season.

The All-America tailback from Penn State capped his junior season by earning a school record ninth 100-yard rushing game of the season, the 16th in his 18 career starts.

For the season, he gained 1,539 yards

on 198 carries for an eye-popping average of 7.8 yards per carry, tops in the nation. Carter ended the season with 23 touchdowns in addition to his 14 receptions for 123 yards and four kickoff returns for 81 yards.

The Nittany Lion tailback's 2,829 career rushing yards are fifth-best in Penn State history.

The Westerville, Ohio product is ranked fourth nationally in rushing (139.9 ypg), second in scoring (12.5 ppg) and fifth in all-purpose yardage (158.4 ypg) for the season. Carter led the Big Ten in all three categories.

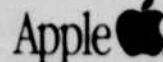
