Bennett key as ASU prepares for 'Cats

TUCSON (AP) — Playing at Arizona State's Activity Center has provided little success for ninth-ranked Arizona the last three years, and a big part of it has to do with Arizona State center Mario Bennett. The Wildcats are 1-2 against the Sun Devils, 0-2 when Bennett plays. In 1992, Bennett, a freshman, scored a career-high 35 points as Arizona State won 77-74. Last year, Bennett scored 20 points in the Devils' 94-87 win.

Arizona (9-2) will play at No. 15 Arizona State (9-2) Thursday in the Pac-10 opener for both teams.

"He's going to be a player we need to contain. He's a big part of their offense and a big part of what they do," Arizona guard Damon Stoudamire said. "It will be important for us to slow him down; whether we have to front him or double-team him, we definitely have to slow him down."

Bennett is averaging 17 points and 7.6 rebounds, but he plays his best in the tough games. Against Arizona State's three ranked opponents, No. 16 Michigan, No. 7 Maryland and No. 21 Oklahoma State, Bennett has averaged 21 points and 8.5 rebounds in leading the Sun Devils to victory.

However, Arizona coach Lute Olson feels the addition of Ben Davis will give the Wildcats the depth they need to contend with Bennett.

"We're much tougher this year in the three (post) spots," Olson said. "I think we'll match up better and we'll be able to keep a fresh guy on him. In the past, (Joseph Blair and Ray Ows) had to play a lot of minutes against him."

Davis, who is averaging 13 points and eight rebounds in three games, said he is looking forward to the matchup.

"(Mario's) a pro in waiting," Davis said. "It's going to be a tough game, a fun game."

"I like playing against people who can play. It ain't no fun playing against scrubs. People who can play make you play, or you'll get killed."

The Sun Devils and Wildcats are among five Pac-10 teams ranked in the top-25. Arizona believes if it can win, it will be an early advantage in the conference race.

"This race is going to be wide open," Stoudamire said. "This is the first big game. Whoever wins this game will have the upper hand. With us, even more so, because it's Arizona State's home court, even

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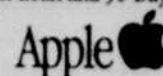
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
