Wrestlers start busy weekend

The Oregon wrestling team started off the new year with a bang Thursday, beating Cal State Fullerton in the first of four meets the team has scheduled in three days.

The team, which was ranked 24th in the nation before the meets, wrestled Cal State Bakersfield at 7:30 Thursday and takes on Fresno State on Friday

and Cal Poly San Luis Obispo on Saturday.

The team lost its only Pacific-10 meet of the year against Oregon State on Dec. 16 at MacArthur Court, though junior Kevin Roberts and redshirt freshman Jeremy Ensrud had strong matches. Roberts is ranked fourth in the 118-pound weight class and Ensrud is

ranked seventh in the 126-pound weight class.

Against Cal State Fullerton, the team lost only two matches even though some of the teams top wrestlers, including Roberts, did not wrestle.

True freshman Royce Repenn won convincingly over Fullerton's John Dy Reyes.

Boyer leads Duck women past UCLA

The Oregon women made it a clean sweep Thursday night over the UCLA teams, beating up on the Bruin women in Los Angeles, 84-59.

The Ducks took a seven-point lead into the locker room at the half, before opening up an insurmountable lead over the Bruins in the second half.

Oregon forward Arianne Boyer led the Ducks with 21 points and grabbed 11 rebounds. Forward

Betty Ann Boeving followed closely with 20 points and center Renae Fegent chipped in with 15.

Forward Kellie Bennett led UCLA with 16 points as the Bruins drop to 5-5 (0-1 Pac-10) on the season.

Oregon improves to 8-2, 1-0 on the season and travels across town to take on USC to complete a Southern California swing.

From time to time late in the game Jeremy Asher would make a hit on somebody that had squirted through the line. After making the hit, a battered Asher occasionally remained on the turf. With the score moving more and more in Penn State's favor, it would have been just as easy to give up, show signs of frustration and lose composure. But time and time again, Asher leaped up from the turf as if to say "This is the Rose Bowl damn it, and no matter what the score is, we're going to finish the game strong."

And it wasn't just Asher. Ricky Whittle and the offensive line had no intentions of quitting as the junior tailback pounded in the final score of the game with nothing more than pride at stake.

It has become almost cliched for coaches to refer to their players as a "class act" and "the best bunch of kids" they've ever been associated with. Somehow, considering everything that has happened this season, when Rich Brooks reflects on things

and says that the 1994 Ducks are some of the most quality people he has ever been around, it's hard not to believe him.

So even though the Ducks didn't win, the Rose Bowl was a story book ending to an unbelievable season.

"It was a tremendous experience," Asher said reflecting on the week of the Rose Bowl. "I have a lot of great memories — stuff I'll have with me for the rest of my life."

In short, the Rose Bowl represents everything that is good about college football. Joe Paterno vs. Oregon's own Fighting Ducks. Now that's stuff to get excited about.

Seeing Paterno and Oregon coach Rich Brooks interact during the week before the game, it seemed a shame that one of these class acts would have to return home on the losing end of the game.

Brooks looked like a kid in a candy store for most of the time leading up to the game. And why not? Here's a guy that was pegged for the unemployment line by most at the beginning of the season. I can't even begin to imagine the amount of satisfaction Brooks must be keeping to himself as this, his 18th year at the helm of the Ducks, proved to be his greatest ever.

"It's been wonderful," a grin-

ning Brooks said about the whole experience in between bites of his post game sandwich.

The experience of the Rose Bowl transcends all definitions of a college football game. The Ducks weren't playing for a National Championship. For that matter, either was Penn State as it turned out.

It just didn't matter though. For the Ducks and their fans, this represented what could have been considered only a dream as the 1994 season got underway. Unlike a Penn State or a USC, Oregon doesn't get this kind of chance very often, especially after a 1-2 start.

"These guys haven't been to a Rose Bowl in a long time," a reporter uttered in response to the Oregon fans cheering as the halftime total offensive yardage was announced.

The score was 14-7 in Penn State's favor at the half, but every victory, no matter how meaningless (such as total offense), was to be savored by the pack of Yellow and Green from the Pacific Northwest.

That was the beauty of the whole thing. Who ever said you were supposed to know how to act at a big event such as the Rose Bowl? It sure was fun finding out though.
