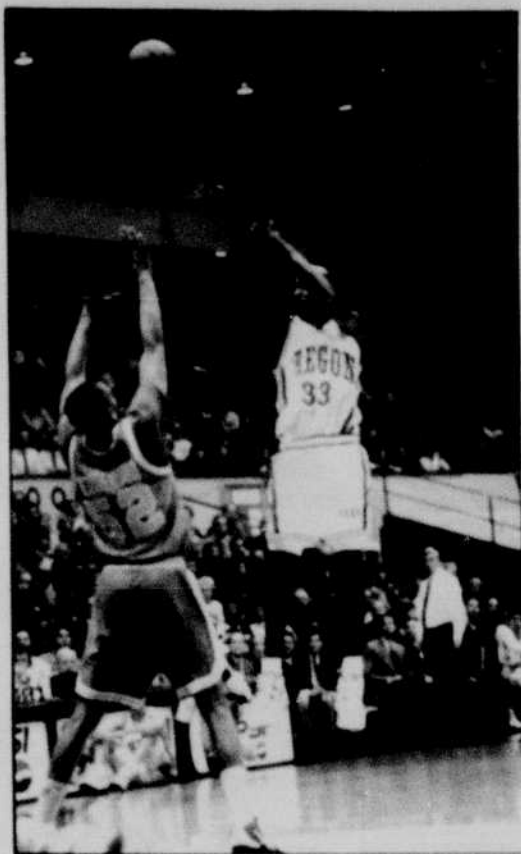

Shooting 73 percent from the charity stripe in the second half was a pleasant surprise from the Ducks, as was the team's 11 steals and eight rebound margin over the Bruins.

Kenya Wilkins finished the game with 16 points on several key drives to the basket for floating layups and Aaron Johnson chipped in 15 points.
