

Tennis teams return to action

This weekend both the Oregon men's and women's tennis teams swing back into action, preparing for a tough spring schedule.

Last weekend, the men's team traveled to Seattle for the Pacific-10 Conference Indoor Championships. The Ducks, sporting their best team in years, went to Seattle wanting to just play well against many of the nation's top teams.

"It was a high class, high caliber tournament," Oregon head coach Buzz Summers said.

Although the Ducks weren't able to come away with more than one victory, Summers was impressed with the team's effort.

"Everyone played well," Summers said.

The men's next action starts today at Santa Clara before the team moves on to face 23rd-ranked California. California fig-

ures to be the team to beat this weekend as the Bears' Mike Hill and Casey Louie are ranked 26th and 85th in the nation respectively.

In a weekend that will end with the Ducks playing the underdog role, Hans Forsberg will sit atop Oregon's seeding ladder.

The women's team, not having played in a tournament since November, will be facing possibly its toughest competitors that it will see all year at this weekend's women's Pac-10 Indoor Championships.

"The Pac-10 Indoor Championships will put us up against seven teams that are ranked in the top 20," Oregon first-year head coach Wade Judy said.

This year's team is in a rebuilding phase, and its main goal, stressed by Judy, is to be competitive and play hard. Judy has seen improvement in his team throughout the year and believes that this weekend will be a good

opportunity to see how far the Ducks have progressed since late September.

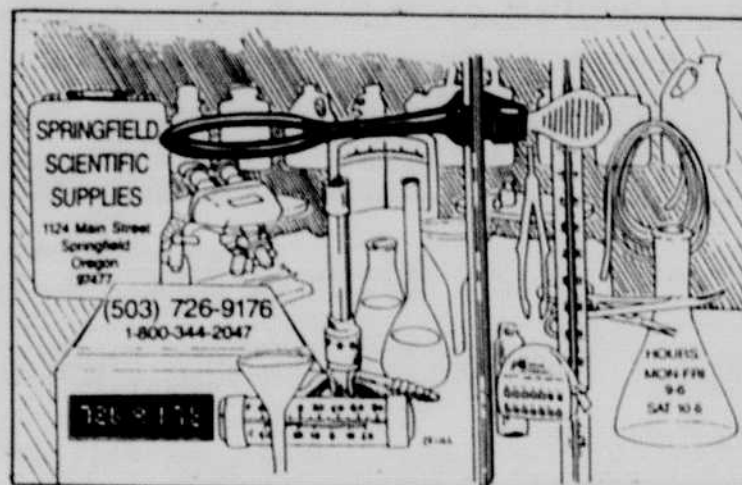
"This Pac-10 Championships is going to be very challenging," Judy said. "It's a fantastic opportunity."

The Ducks will sport junior Elise Adams and senior Kara Yoshida as the top seeds for this weekend. Adams has been hampered with an injury but is figured to play anyhow. Yoshida, however, has been playing at the top of her game.

At the Rolex Regional Intercollegiate Tennis Championships, Yoshida placed fifth, knocking off Washington State's top-seeded Emma Lin, to capture the consolation final.

Behind their top seeds, the Ducks just want to possibly position themselves in an upset role.

"We want to be realistic and maybe pull out some upsets," Judy said.



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Howard and Doleman head expansion list

The list includes a Super Bowl MVP, a Heisman Trophy winner, a six-time Pro Bowl selection and more than 600 pounds of Perry brothers.

Mark Rypien, Desmond Howard, Chris Doleman, and William and Michael Dean Perry are among the players who will be available in the NFL expansion draft.

On Thursday, the league released the list of players who can be picked in the Feb. 15 draft by the expansion teams Carolina Panthers and Jacksonville Jaguars, who will both begin play next season.

Each of the 28 established teams must make six players available in the draft. All those teams submitted their lists except Super Bowl opponents San Francisco and San Diego, who don't have to send in their names until Jan. 31.

Rypien, who quarterbacked the Washington Redskins to victory in the 1992 Super Bowl, was Vinny Testaverde's backup at Cleveland last season.

"He knows the Browns are committed to Vinny Testaverde," said his agent, Ken Stanninger. "He was a bit frustrated he didn't get to contribute

more. Carolina or Jacksonville are certainly attractive to him."

Howard won the 1991 Heisman Trophy at Michigan, but the wide receiver has been a disappointment during his three seasons with the Redskins.

Doleman was 1992 NFC defensive player of the year with Minnesota, which traded him to Atlanta last season. Although he's on the expansion list, his \$2.7 million salary may scare off the Panthers and Jaguars.

William "The Refrigerator" Perry rose to fame in 1985 as a member of Chicago's Super Bowl champion team. After being released by the Bears in 1993, the 335-pound defensive lineman signed with Philadelphia.

Michael Dean Perry is smaller (285 pounds) than his brother, but is considered a much better lineman. A five-time Pro Bowl choice with the Cleveland Browns, he had 69 tackles and four sacks this season.

Fourteen former Pro Bowl players and 12 first-round draft picks were on the expansion list.
