"I think they got it back," Harrick said about the enormous edge a capacity Mac Court crowd can deliver.

Remembering coming to the Pit as an assistant coach to take on the Dick Harter Ducks of 1977, Harrick knows first-hand how Mac Court could affect a game, but pointed out that, until lately, the court had lost some of its magic.

"Since that time we handled

(the Ducks) up (in Eugene)," Harrick said about the years since the late 1970s Ducks. "But Jerry Green's got them rolling. They are a good team."

The Ducks haven't beaten The Wildcats since 1990-91 when Oregon upset the 'Cats at Mac Court 68-63. Since then, the Ducks have lost seven straight against Arizona.

The Ducks have lost eight of the last nine games against Arizona State, with the one win coming last season in Eugene. In the win, the Ducks benefited from an incredibly balanced attack that saw six Ducks hit double figures. Jordy Lyden

poured in 14 points in just eight minutes of play.

Junior Renae Fegent became the first Duck from the women's basketball team to garner Pac-10 player of the week honors.

The 6-foot-3 Australian center racked up 41 points, 12 rebounds, five blocked shots, four assists and four steals in a sweep over the Washington schools. Fegent has recovered from an early-season shooting slump to remain as the Ducks' overall scoring leader (17.4 points per game), pacing the scoring attack in eight of 14 appearances.

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lacking for so many years, now has the services of 70-100 point scorer Al MacInnis and goaltender Jon Casey. Casey, who took the Bruins to the playoffs last year, will serve as All-Star goaltender Curtis Joseph's back-up.

In the first two games of the season, the Blues have outscored their opponents 12-3. One of those victories being a 7-1 waxing of the Canucks. If St. Louis keeps

this horrid pace, who will beat them?

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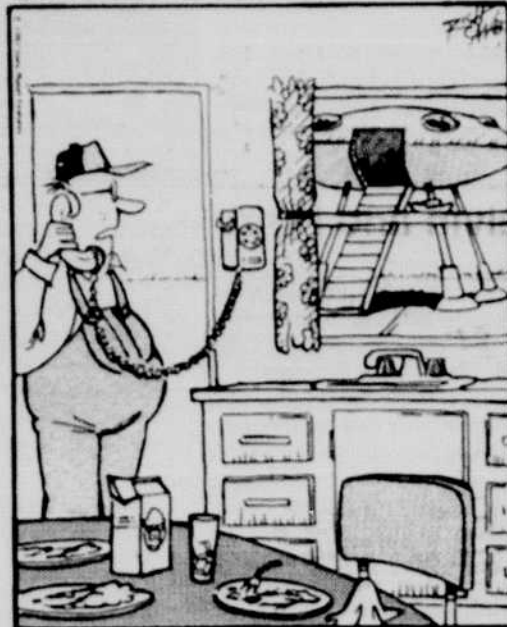
