Beyond the numbers in Williams' portfolio, there are the awards he has earned as a member of the Oregon basketball team.

cious, we can't make a free-throw and we're being out-rebounded by eight a game.

"Statistically we're 4-13 and not 13-4. But I know the reason we're hanging in there and that's because of our defense. We play extremely hard defensively, and we make things happen in the way of turnovers with our defense. That has saved us so far."

Also acting as savior for Arizona State is senior forward Mario Bennett, who is averaging about 17 points and 8 rebounds a game to rank among the Pac-10 leaders in both categories. He also leads the league in blocked shots (3.3).

The Sun Devils attack with a three-guard line-

up, led offensively by Isaac Burton's 15 points per game. Marcel Capers mans the point guard slot, averaging 6.6 assists, while wreaking havoc against opposing players. Quincy Brewer chips in 6.5 points and nearly five rebounds per game.

Arizona State leads the rivalry against Oregon, 23-14, including eight of the last nine encounters. Oregon won the last meeting between the two schools with an 87-80 triumph at Mac Court last February.

"The biggest concern that I have besides (Oregon's) depth is that they have guard play that can handle our press," Frieder said. "If we don't do something with their guards, then we have no chance."

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## Three-game trip continues with Pistons

DETROIT (AP) — The Portland Trail Blazers resume their three-game trip Thursday night when they take on the Detroit Pistons.

Portland opened its Eastern swing with a 105-99 loss Tuesday night at New York.

The Blazers (20-18) hit only three of 23 3-point shots and threw away an 11-point lead late in the third quarter.

Portland's 13 percent from long range was its worst mark since the distance was shortened this season to a uniform 22 feet.

The Blazers lost despite Rod Strickland's career-high 36 points. He sank 15 of 21 shots, 71.4 percent, while the other Blazers were 23 of 77, 29.9 percent.

The Detroit Pistons (12-25) are coming off a 116-105 home victory over Philadelphia Tuesday night. At the bottom of the Central Division, the Pistons are 8-10 in Detroit.

Portland will complete its trip Friday night at Cleveland.

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
