No. 11 Iowa State shuts down Northern Iowa with big scoring

CEDAR FALLS, Iowa (AP) — Loren Meyer dominated inside with 23 points and No. 11 Iowa State shut down Northern Iowa for an 81-62 victory Wednesday night.

Iowa State (16-2) ran off two big scoring bursts en route to a 16-point halftime lead, then held Northern Iowa to two baskets over the first nine minutes of the second half while increasing its lead to 33.

Northern Iowa (5-13) did a decent job on Fred Hoiberg, Iowa State's leading scorer, but had no answer for Meyer. The 6-foot-10 senior made nine of 13 shots, including three dunks, grabbed seven rebounds and blocked three shots.

Hoiberg, averaging 19.5 points, scored 16 after going 3-for-8 in the first half. Julius Michalik added 10 points for the Cyclones, who beat Northern Iowa for the 18th time in the last 19 games.

Jason Daisy led Northern Iowa with 15 points and Jason Sims scored 13.

Northern Iowa had only 33 points midway through the second half and made it respectable only after Iowa State's reserves were in the game.

Iowa State trailed by six points early before using its two first-half runs to take control.

Meyer sparked the first one, scoring eight points in a 13-0 burst that pulled the Cyclones from a 14-9 deficit into a 22-14 lead. Northern Iowa went scoreless for 5 minutes before Daisy hit a jumper.

Iowa State never trailed after that. It was 27-22 when the Cyclones went on a 9-0 run that ended with Meyer's dunk and Hoiberg's 3-pointer.

Hoiberg hit another 3-pointer less than three minutes later for a 41-27 lead.

Iowa State began the second half with a 21-4 run to increase its lead 64-31. Meyer, Hoiberg and Michalik each scored six points in that stretch. Except for a jumper by Michalik, all of Iowa State's baskets in the run were or dunks.

Meyer played only 6 minutes in the second half and Iowa State coach Tim Floyd had all of his starters out by the 7:15 mark.

It might have been Iowa State's last game at Northern Iowa. Iowa State officials have said they want to play the Panthers only at home from now on.

Michigan State defeats Minnesota Gophers

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) — Jon Garavaglia hit a jumper from the left corner with 6.8 seconds remaining Wednesday night and No. 10 Michigan State overcame its worst shooting night of the season to beat Minnesota 54-53.

The victory was the fourth by two points or fewer for the Spartans (13-2, 5-1 Big Ten) over the past six games.

Voshon Lenard had given the Gophers (13-6, 4-3) a 53-52 lead with a jumper from the top of the key with 28 seconds to go. The Spartans worked the ball around until they found Garavaglia open on the baseline.

Minnesota inbounded the ball after a timeout with 2.9 seconds left, but Eric Snow stole it from Lenard and ran out the final seconds.

Snow finished with 13 points for Michigan State, while Lenard led Minnesota with 14.

Michigan State, which leads the Big Ten in field-goal percentage shot only 36 percent against the Gophers. The Spartans' previous low was 42 percent in an overtime loss to

Nebraska.

Minnesota wasn't much better from the field, making only 37.5 percent of its shots.

Michigan State scoreless for a 5:42 stretch midway through the second half, while the Gophers went on an 8-0 run to lead 45-41 with eight minutes to play.

A 3-pointer by Shawn Respert, who led the Spartans with 20 points, gave Michigan State a 50-49 lead with 3:45 left. There were three more lead changes before Garavaglia's winning basket.

Michigan State used an 11-2 run late in the first half to go ahead 28-24, but Lenard hit a 3 from the corner as the shot clock expired during the final minute to slice the margin to 28-27 at halftime.

The Spartans, who have shot 50 percent or more in 10 of their first 15 shots.

Minnesota took a 13-5 lead, hitting six of its first eight shots, but the Gophers also cooled off and Michigan State finally went ahead on two free throws by Ray Weathers with three minutes left in the half.

No. 5 Kentucky uses defense to beat Tennessee

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — Rodrick Rhodes scored a career-high 29 points, becoming the 41st player in Kentucky history to score 1,000 points, and led the fifth-ranked Wildcats to a 69-50 victory over Tennessee on Wednesday night.

Rhodes, a junior forward, hit a 3-pointer with 49 seconds to go as he was left in the game with reserves in order to reach the milestone.

Kentucky (13-2, 7-0 Southeastern Conference) registered its seventh consecutive victory with a pressing defense that forced Tennessee (7-8, 2-5) to commit a season-high 27 turnovers and shoot a season-low 29 percent (15-for-51).

Kentucky, leading 28-17 at halftime, broke the game open with a 22-2 run for a 49-25 lead with 9:45 remaining. Guard Jeff Sheppard scored nine points in the spurt, four coming on dunks.



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
