Choice

I am writing in response to Wednesday's article "Pro-choice may lose funding." The article states that Students for Choice may infringe on some student's First Amendment rights. This infringement can only occur if Students for Choice uses student fees to promote political viewpoints and/or political activity.

Students for Choice does not use student fees for these purposes; the student fees we receive each year are used only for educational and cultural purposes. We act as disseminators of factual information that is geared to educate students as to their rights under U.S. laws, such as Roe vs. Wade and the Hyde Amendment.

Any political activity that we participate in is financed by a specially-designated account. This account is maintained through fund raising and is not supported in any way through student fees. Because Students

for Choice does not use student fees to fund the promotion of any political viewpoints and/or political activity, funding our organization does not infringe on any student's First Amendment rights.

From our start as a student organization, Students for Choice has realized that not all students agree with our political positions. We honor their right to disagree with these positions and have made it mandatory that our organization never uses student fees for purposes that are not educational or cultural because of this right.
