

Cal freshman awarded

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. (AP) — California forward Tremaine Fowlkes became the first freshman in two years to be named Pac-10 basketball player of the week, league Commissioner Tom Hansen announced Monday.

The last freshman to win the honor was Mario Bennett of Arizona State on Feb. 24, 1992.

Fowlkes, a 6-foot-6 Los Ange-

les native, came off the bench to lead the Golden Bears to a sweep of then-No. 4 UCLA and USC on the road with a combined 40 points and 15 rebounds.

Fowlkes is averaging 13.1 points and 6.4 rebounds, both second on the team. The Bears are now 9-5 overall, 3-4 in Pac-10 play.
