day would have been sophomore guard Rick Osborn, who had been in a season-long slump. But Osborn picked the most opportune time to step up his game as he poured in 18 points. Senior Jerry Adams, who had lost to the Beavers all 10 in his five years at Oregon, added 14 rebounds as the Ducks sank 12 of their total 18 free throws in the final 5:01 to play and racked up a 60-47 win.

The Beavers rebounded, however, and won eight of the next nine meetings. In coming off of a 30-point performance against the Ducks just two days earlier, sophomore sensation Gary Payton led his team to Mac Court in search of their fifth straight Civil War win.

But much to the Beavers' surprise, the Ducks—who had 17 turnovers and were only 7 of 25 from the field in the second half in the previous meeting—came out and kept the game tough, holding a 60-55 lead with just 1:37 remaining in the game.

After two Oregon turnovers, however, the Beavers took the lead 61-60 and it looked as though Oregon State would pull

out yet another victory with the help of Oregon's 17 total turnovers.

With two seconds on the clock, Oregon's Randy Grant, who ended the game with seven rebounds and 14 points, grabbed a loose rebound and hit the game-winning lay-up moments before Oregon fans mobbed the floor, giving the Ducks first win at the Pit since 1979.

Last year, however, marked one of the wildest Civil Wars in history. At halftime, Oregon State only held a 37-34 after Oregon shot only 36 percent from the field, but the Ducks play caught up to them in the second half, as the Ducks went on to a 12-4 run.

The Ducks came back, however, and went ahead 73-71 on freshman Kenya Wilkins' two free throws, only to watch Jelani Boline hit a three to send the game into the first of two overtimes.

The Ducks survived the first overtime, even though they were without four players because of fouls, but fell apart in the second, as the Beavers capitalized on the lack of starters and hit 14 free throws before clinching a 101-91 victory.

Oregon on the Beavers' home court gave the Ducks the edge going into this Saturday's potential sweep of Oregon State. In the game, Barry racked up 31 points and grabbed seven boards.

One of the big reasons the Beavers have been able to turn things around a bit is the switch at the point-guard position. Freshman Rob Williams has taken over as the quarterback for the Beavers, averaging 10.3 points over the last four games. Williams has shown steady improvement since taking over six games ago and is coming off a 12-point performance against Stanford.

Another Beaver who has been hot as of late is center Vladimir Heredia. The 6-foot-7 Heredia recorded the first double-double of his Oregon State career with 14 points and 10 rebounds in the Beavers' win over Cal. The Cal win is extra ammunition for the Beavers as they broke a 17-game losing streak away from home with the upset.
