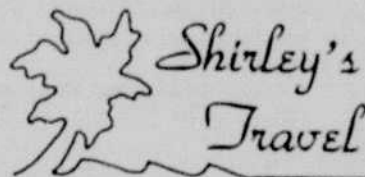

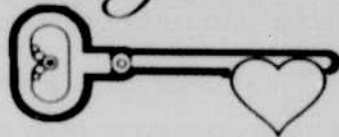

Project Saferide needs met by Finance Committee

Because of the increased popularity of the service it provides, Project Saferide is feeling growing pains. ASUO Programs Finance Committee Thursday recognized Saferide's welcome problem by allocating it a budget of \$33,796 for the 1995-96 fiscal year.

"Because our ridership doubled last year," said Kristi Miller, co-director of Saferide, "We've had to implement some policy changes."

Some of those changes were limiting the size of groups Saferide will pick up to not more than three women at a time.

The finance committee granted what looks like more than a 50 percent increase. However, Saferide's budget this year contains money allocated to them in last spring by a student ballot measure. Excluding the ballot measure, Saferide's budget was \$22,015 for 1994-95, \$11,781 less than next year's budget.

Students approved a ballot measure providing Saferide with \$20,319 in student fees to purchase a new van and \$13,248 to pay for a second dispatcher position.

Hearings continued Thursday for the Asian/Pacific American Student Union. A previously scheduled budget hearing was postponed last week because of time restraints. The committee

was deadlocked on a proposal which would have cut APASU's budget by 4 percent.

At the outset of the hearings, the committee was asked to comment individually on how they judged student programs.

Committee members each addressed the question, citing the main criteria they look for when assessing program budgets. Fiscal responsibility, fundraising and other past history considerations were mentioned.

Committee Chairman Joey Lyons then proposed an amended budget that, while smaller than what APASU wanted, was passed by the committee. Next year APASU will receive \$9,048

in student fee funding, a 3.4 percent increase over the current budget.

The Student Bar Association will have to do more with less next year, receiving more than a 4 percent decrease. The group of law students, who argued that increasing class size at the law school warranted a larger budget, got \$10,435.

Two programs got exactly what they asked for Thursday. The Oregon Daily Emerald asked for and received its request for \$129,000 for printing costs. The ASUO Constitution Court also sought no increase. The committee granted the Court \$1,943, a zero percent increase.
