Women prove perfect in tennis home opener

The Oregon women's tennis team squared off against Pacific Lutheran on Friday, in its first home match of the 1994-95 season. The Ducks swept all the matches in the duel meet 9-0.

Oregon's first home competition of the season was taken very seriously by the Ducks' players, not because of the toughness of the Lutes but because of the team's early season goal.

"We have a goal," Oregon head coach Wade Judy said. "It's to win all of our home matches."

Judy, knowing the competition provided by Pacific Lutheran was not going to be nearly as tough as what awaits his team in the future, was impressed with the way the Ducks took care of business.

The Ducks were forced to play without their No. 1 seed for the second-straight weekend as Elise Adams is still

suffering from a hamstring injury. "Right now her return is iffy," Judy said. "We are being cautiously optimistic for this coming weekend, but it is a touchy situation with a hamstring injury."

The highlight of the duel meet was the victory posted by the No. 6 seed, Kassandra Slangan. After winning her first set 6-3 and losing the second set 3-6, Slangan bounced back in the third and final set winning 6-3.

"She was able to rally back," Judy said. "That can be a tough thing to do when you lose the second set because usually the momentum is going in the other direction."

Prior to this weekend, Slangan was the team's eighth seed and had been moved to the top six because of the injury sustained by Adams and another sustained by Allison Sosnow. Sosnow is expected to make her return to the lineup, either as the second or third seed, when they travel to Idaho this weekend.

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dent Chris Lampe said. "It's tough to compete when you have starters that are injured and not able to play."

In the second game, Oregon was able to produce points, but that wasn't nearly enough as they fell for the sixth straight game, 17-3 to the Ashland men's club. Despite good play from a number of starters, namely Forwards Greg Smith and Dave Dyer and defenseman John Irish, the Ducks remain winless this season.

"All its going to take is a lot of practice," Lampe said. "We've shown a great deal of improvement over last weekend. We have a long way to go, but I think things are looking better."

Oregon will play its first league match of the year next weekend in Walla Walla, Wash. against Whitman University. The champions of the Western Conference will go to regionals in California in mid-April.

"We aren't really looking at regionals at this point," Lampe said. "Also, we have the four-time defending national champion Cal Berkeley in our division."

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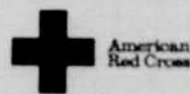
