The Oregon Daily Emerald, the independent student newspaper at the University of Oregon, is accepting applications for the position of Editor for the 1995-96 academic year.

To be eligible, a candidate must be:

• An undergraduate student at the University enrolled for a minimum of six credit hours per term in three of the four academic quarters of his or her term as Editor, or

• A graduate student at the University enrolled for a minimum of three credit hours per term in three of the four academic quarters of his or her term as Editor.

Applicants must be in good academic standing. Prior newsroom experience required.

The Oregon Daily Emerald is published by a non-profit corporation that operates independently of the University. The primary purpose of the ODE is to provide education and training for students in all aspects of newspaper operation by serving a campus audience with news, editorial and advertising content.

The Editor of the ODE, who reports to a 10-person volunteer Board of Directors, has responsibility for all editorial operations and all editorial content of the newspaper. Term of office is June 6, 1995, through the last issue of Spring term 1996 and is preceded by an orientation period that begins no later than May 2 and extends through June 5. This is a paid position.

Completed applications must be returned to the ODE Board of Directors in the ODE office by 5:00 p.m., Friday, March 31, 1995. An individual will be selected by the Board on April 18, 1995.

Ducks disappoint in softball action

Once again the Oregon softball team got off to a hot start only to fizzle out in the end as the Ducks won their first two games and lost their last four to close out the UNLV Spring Fling Tournament in Las Vegas over the weekend.

The Ducks jumped out to an impressive opening-round pair of victories with a 5-3 win over Utah State and a tight 3-2 victory over Pacific. Oregon pitcher Barbie McGillivray upped her record to 5-3 after going the dis-

tance in both games.

Oregon ran into trouble on Saturday, though, as the Ducks lost an eight-inning affair to Toledo, closing out pool play for Oregon. Toledo put up two runs in the top of the eighth to break a 1-1 deadlock, and the Ducks could only muster one run in their half of the eighth in falling 3-2.

In their first game of bracket play, the Ducks fell to the host-team UNLV. The Duck bats went flat against their hosts, as Oregon could only manage four hits on its way to a 3-1 loss.

Sunday was more of the same for the streaking Ducks. Oregon scored just one run apiece in losses to their in-state rival Oregon State, 4-1, and to Toledo, 2-1.

Against Oregon State, McGillivray was victimized for four runs in the top of the fourth inning to seal the Ducks' fate. Toledo beat the Ducks for the second straight day by a slim 2-1 tally as the Ducks finished last in the eight-team tournament.

With the losses, the Ducks now stand at 5-7 for the year.

Women's tennis team drops pair

The Oregon women's tennis team suffered a pair of losses over the weekend against Colorado and Weber State.

Oregon's Ashley Fuller was the only Duck to come away with a singles victory against Weber State, which handled the Ducks 7-2. The Colorado Buffaloes stuck Oregon with a 8-1 loss with the

No. 3 pair of Fuller and Kara Yoshida providing the only win for the Ducks with a 6-4, 6-0 victory over Colorado's Melissa Schmel and Claire Gatt. In singles play, Yoshida took the first set 6-1 against Colorado's Chris Bowers in the No. 1 match, but Bowers came back to dump Oregon's No. 1 seed, 6-1, 6-2 to close out the match.

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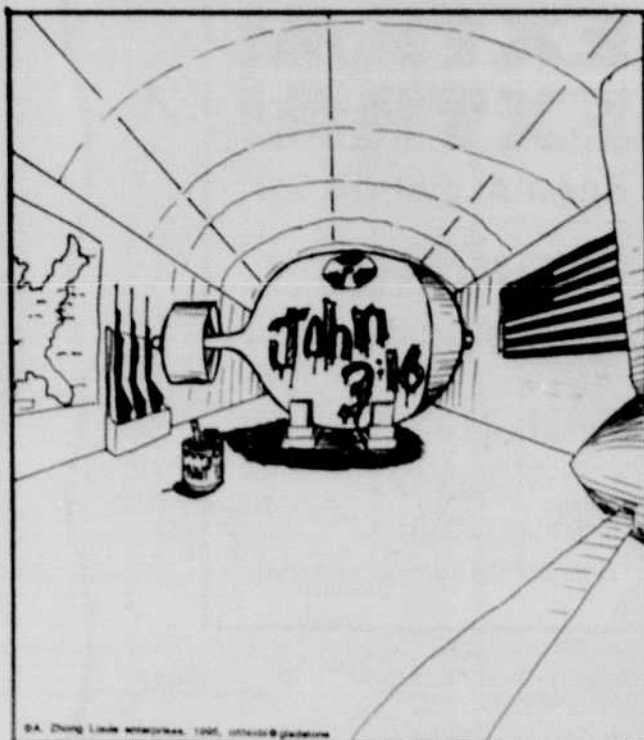
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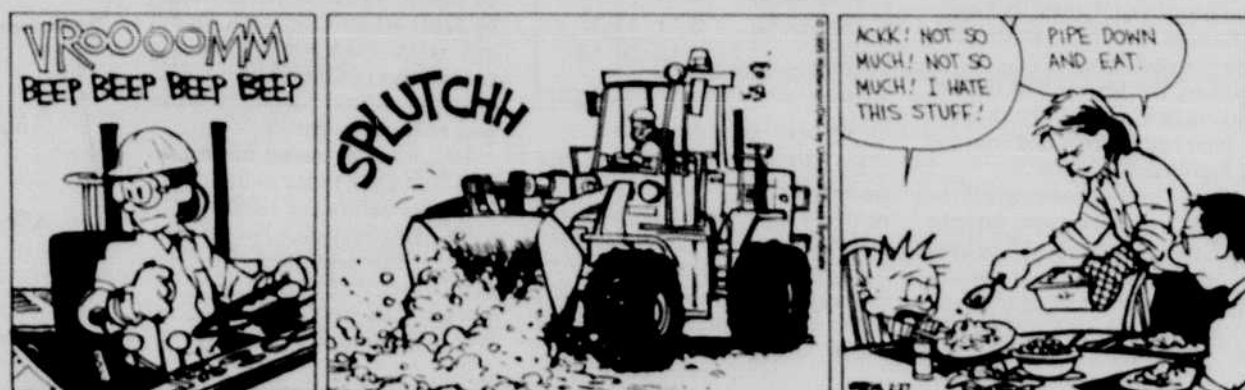
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
