"A lot of coach Green's style has to do with where he's come from," Johnson said. "Obviously North Carolina and Kansas are winning programs and he wanted to install those things at this program."

"Coach Green is a very personable coach. Off the floor you can go into his office and talk about anything. You know his door is always open."
