passing 160 feet on two occasions to account for the women's second NCAA provisional qualifier. Commissioning came within three one-hundredths of a second of her lifetime 400 best in Arizona and has tremendous range as a sprinter.

"The other person going strong right now is Sara Jessie," Heinonen said. "She's already [achieved personal records] in both the long jump and triple jump and will be a key contributor certainly for us this weekend against Washington."

Freshman Jennifer Thomas has already demonstrated her versatility by qualifying for the Pac-10 Conference heptathlon championships in her collegiate debut in Arizona.

Sophomore transfer Tamara Schurch is another newcomer visibly involved in the direction the team is taking this year. The Canadian native is still adjusting to her new surroundings after running only indoors in Calgary but is entered in the 400-meter dash as well as the 400-meter hurdles, the long jump and the 400 relay for Saturday.

Because of overall inexperience, it is in the hurdles and the horizontal jumps that Oregon finds its major concerns. The graduated departure of the All-American Blair has left a hole in both areas, and it is Heinonen's hope that someone will be able to step up in her absence.

According to Heinonen, the group of distance runners is young, but will get better as the season progresses, while Tonia Brewer will be relied upon heavily in the shot put and discus events.

Saturday, Washington will try to exploit its advantage in the hurdles and the throws and try to steal points in the distance events due to the probable absence of Glusac in the dual meet.

Heinonen carries a 91-13 ledger into his 19th season and, since dropping the first confrontation to Washington at Hayward Field, the Ducks have proceeded to win the last eight meetings at home between the two schools. Overall, Oregon owns a 15-3 advantage since the series originated in 1977.

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
