

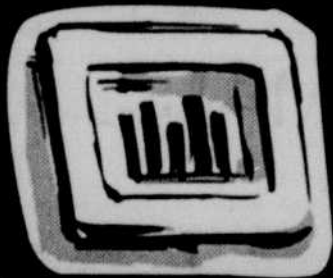

Bells to keep campus time

The University unveiled its new, nearly \$20,000 carillon bell system Wednesday, and officials expect the chimes to be fully operational today, sounding every 15 minutes.

"Traditional time-keeping carillon pieces" let students know what time it is, said University Provost John Moseley, who presented the new bell system with Eugene Mayor Ruth Bascom.

The bells will sound four times hourly via four directional speakers atop the EMU, said assistant EMU director Frank Geltner. Four distinct tunes will sound each hour, differentiating the 15 minute intervals.

The EMU Board of Directors contributed \$10,000 toward the bell system's \$18,740 price tag, board member Zach Kelton said. The remaining money came from private donors, he said.

The bells will ring for 11 hours Monday through Friday, from 9 a.m. until 10 p.m. During weekends, the bells will sound from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m.

The new bell system will also be used to play songs on special occasions, such as graduation, Geltner said.

An earlier carillon bell system helped students across the University keep time for nearly 40 years, until the system wore out in 1990.

A new carillon system had been on the the EMU wish-list since 1990, when the old system failed and was too old to fix, Geltner said. The bells will recreate a tradition in the University community, he said.

The new carillon system, which resembles a 5-foot stereo speaker, will play automatically, Geltner said. The system can also play music from programed disks, and original music can be played on its keyboard and saved.

The School of Music will help record a library of University-related songs.

Moseley and Bascom demonstrated the new system's capabilities, treating an almost 50-member audience to several keyboard solos. The presentation included renditions of the University's fight and pledge songs.

"When we win the Rose Bowl we can play that 24 hours a day," Moseley said.

The new system, which does not actually use any bells, "should last as long as the last one," said Mike Tedrow, of Schulmerich Carillons Inc., the company that made both the original and the new bell systems.

The 37-note carillon uses electronically generated bell tones which were digitally sampled from actual bells.

"You're not hearing a synthesizer," Tedrow said. "You're actually hearing a bell that's being reproduced."

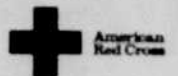
