behind at the beginning of the tie-break. Being down 1-2, and then 2-3, Sosnow used two breaks of serve and two service points to go ahead 6-3, needing only one more point for the victory.

Burnham won the next two points to bring the tie-break score to 6-5. However, Sosnow's serve was strong on the next point, and Burnham fell to Sosnow 6-2, 7-6 (7-5).

"It's nice for her to get a win like that because anytime you come back and win it boosts your confidence so much," Judy said. "She's been playing great tennis all year; to win a tie-breaker like that at the No. 1 spot for a freshman is excellent."

Other notables for the Ducks on Saturday were Caryn King at No. 2, 6-3, 6-1, Yoshida 6-4, 6-3, and Hannah King at No. 4, 6-4, 6-3.

The Ducks come back home for two straight meets at Hayward Field, starting with the Oregon Invitational next Saturday and the Pepsi Team Invitational — in which tough Nebraska, Michigan and Washington State teams will compete — the following weekend.

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
