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Yoshida earns Pac-10 honor

Oregon's Kara Yoshida was selected to the Pacific 10 North Division All-Conference Team for the third time in her four-year career on Tuesday.

The Waimea, Hawaii, native has led a young Duck women's tennis squad to a 9-9 record this season. Earlier this year, she captured fifth place at the Rolex Regional Championships and carries a 10-18 record at the No. 1 singles position.

In 1992, she was named Oregon's Most Valuable Player and received her first all-conference selection. She currently ranks seventh on the Ducks' 55-name career-victory list.
