legislative and community relations at the University. "I'm hopeful they will add back \$20 million or \$30 million, but even this won't be nearly enough."

Although House and Senate members have yet to vote on the Republican budget, which was crafted by Senator Brady Adams, R-Grants Pass, higher education officials said they are taking it seriously.

"This is significant because Sen. Adams is the key person given the responsibility for devel-

oping the Republican budget," said MacDonald, adding that because Republicans are the majority in both houses, Democrats won't be able to overturn the proposed budget if most Republicans support it.

"That's why now is the crucial time to call and write your legislators," MacDonald said. "If people speak up, legislators can still do something to restore the budget."

If the Republican's budget becomes a reality, University officials are not planning to cut programs, said MacDonald. However, student enrollment

access will likely be trimmed, and a four percent tuition increase for the next two years will be imposed.

In their blueprint, Republicans added about \$14 million to the \$596 million to maintain OSSHE's veterinary schools, the Cooperative Extension program, the Ag. Experiment Station and forest research programs.

Republicans slated higher education as one of three recipients for any add-back money in the General Fund. If funds are left toward the end of the legislative session, OSSHE could see \$0-\$30 million in an add-back package.
