the University campus in Charleston, Ore.

The two tickets remaining for executive will face off in the general election on April 26 and 27.

"My biggest focus is getting students to vote," said Kantrowitz.

"Every vote does count," Scott added.

Kelton agreed that rallying students to vote next week is critical.

"It's going to be a close race in the generals because it was so close in the primaries," he said. "This is pretty neck-and-neck at this point."

Williamson added that students should learn as much as possible about the ASUO Executive candidates. "It's really important that the voters know who they are voting for."

Both campaigns vowed to take their message to the students in the week before the general election and to keep the campaigns issue-based.

Kenya Luvert finished third in the race with 402 votes. The Good/Scoenborn ticket finished fourth with 158 votes, and the Farnam/Elder campaign garnered 147 votes.

for by incidental fees — to print a letter to the *Oregon Daily Emerald*. The complaint also states that Lyons used the Student Senate office computer to compose the letter.

Lyons' letter (*ODE*, April 20) urged voters to write him in as a candidate for Senate seat 1. But he was unable to garner enough votes to capute seat 1.

The Elections Board forwarded Grigsby's complaint to the Constitutional Court, who will decide if the board can legally sanction Lyons.

In an informal letter to the Constitutional Court, Lyons admitted that he used the ASUO printer. He also asserted that his letter to the *Emerald* was no different than student senators and ASUO executive officers using fee-funded computers for personal papers.

"I saw my letter to the editor as the same," Lyons wrote. Lyons also wrote that he reimbursed the ASUO for use of the printer after the incident.

"I think Jason's being sort of petty about this," Lyons said.

Lyons may not be in trouble — for now. Before running for office, candidates must sign a petition pledging they and their staff will abide by all ASUO campaign rules.

Jennifer Dziekan, ASUO Elections Coordinator, said Lyons is a write-in candidate for the primary elections, and therefore not subject to campaign regulations.

But if Lyons wins the primaries and moves on to the general elections, the board may have the power to sanction him, she said.

"I really don't want to specu-

late right now to the press about what steps we may take against Joey," Dziekan said.

Grigsby's complaint comes amidst charges of widespread campaign violations among presidential and senatorial camps, Dziekan said. None except Grigsby have filed formal complaints.

The charges have come to the attention of the Elections Board, but the board has only witnessed three or four incidents, most of which dealt with poster violations in the EMU and candidates unknowingly campaigning less than 50 feet from the ballot booths.

"There weren't major violations — nothing to the point that anyone should have been disqualified," she said. Once candidates were told they were in violation of campaign rules, Dziekan said, most began taking steps to comply.

Fliers from the Justin Good-Tom Schoenborn ticket have been found on campus trees, which is in violation of ASUO campaign rules.

Frank Geltner, assistant director for the EMU, said it is illegal to hang campaign fliers from the walls, pillars or windows in the EMU except on office windows and bulletin boards.

Geltner said an EMU building directory in one of the elevators was taken down and replaced by a Chris Kantrowitz-Niki Scott flyer. Since the campaign season began, Geltner has been gathering illegally placed posters and turning them over to the Elections Board.

Dziekan said historically, spring elections have been plagued by campaign violations because of ignorance or outright disregard for campaign rules.
