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Kampfer was once again to be secondary to McGillivray, who finished her 1994 freshman campaign with a 10-5 record and a 2.12 ERA. However, after the Ducks' Feb. 26 4-1 loss to Oregon State at the UNLV Spring Fling, McGillivray announced that she was leaving the team for personal reasons. This unexpected decision made Kampfer the Ducks' top pitcher, immediately placing her in the pitching circle as well as the limelight.

"I really felt the pressure a lot," Kampfer said of her sudden move to the No. 1 pitching position for the Ducks, "because we didn't expect this situation at all. I was just

expecting maybe to work my way up and pitch a few games here and there."

As expected, Kampfer took some bumps and bruises in her first outings as Oregon's starter. She lost her opener against Toledo, 2-1, at the Spring Fling, before picking up consecutive decisions against Simon Frazer at Howe Field.

However, Kampfer's next six outings are ones she would like to just forget. In those games against nationally ranked Arizona, Arizona State, Fresno State and Nebraska, the Ducks lost by a combined score of 50-5.

"Arizona was the first Pac-10 game I've ever started, and it just blew my mind," Kampfer said. "I knew they were going to be great hitters, and they showed that on the scoreboard."

With those games past her, Kampfer has pitched .500 ball including an impressive four-hit shutout of then-No. 8 Hawaii at the Capital Classic in Sacramento, Calif.

"I have just worked into it [the adjustment], and it is fine now — I don't feel the pressure as much," Kampfer said. "The hardest thing was adjusting to the big jump of pitching against the tough hitters of the Pac-10."

With this season's postseason hopes all but dashed, the remaining games give Kampfer time to improve and refine her pitches for next year. The coaching staff began working with her earlier this week on her technique and pitching situations.

"We're trying to refine her pitching so she can throw a strike when she needs to," Oregon head coach Tami Brown said.

"We've worked on hitting the spots and being more precise every pitch," Kampfer said of the practices. "At times I've struggled getting that pitch when I needed it."

Kampfer's outlook for next season is very optimistic for herself and her colleagues. She believes that the performance her team has demonstrated on the field this season is nowhere near its capabilities.

"The outlook for next season is a lot different now because I know what to expect, and I'm not coming into the season without pitching a Pac-10 game like this year," Kampfer said. "I think it will be easier for the team — we all know what we can do which we haven't necessarily done this season. Next season should definitely be better."
