And I'm quite confident in my assumption that the entire Oregon football team would not provide some kind of "payback" to a victim pursuing prosecution in cases against any of its players.

The team, as well as the athletic department and especially the coaches, does not condone the violence in the first place as it makes everyone look bad in the end.

It is true that no one is above the law, and all of the people involved in the football program at Oregon who I have talked to have obviously agreed with this.

It is also important to stress that it indeed

is the very few, not the many, that have been involved in these violent incidents and the rest of the players should be able to walk around campus without feeling like they have something to prove.

In the end, any player who allows himself to get into trouble does nothing if not distance himself from a team and a program presumably dedicated to promoting a winning attitude both on and off the field.

As is the case with almost any group, it is impossible to totally eliminate these negative incidents. But to persecute the whole as being indicative of the few is, for the most part, an unfair practice and should not be subject to the sweeping generalizations that make quality programs look like those that aren't.
