## University professor honored

A University music professor was honored this month for his contributions outside of the classroom and for his leadership in the field of music education.

Dr. Stephen Stone, former assistant-dean of the University's School of Music, was honored this month at the Northwest Division of the Music Educators National Conference as the 1995 recipient of the Distinguished Service Award.

"It's nice to be recognized for what you've done for your profession," said Stone, who is now retired from teaching. "The kinds of things that make [the award] meaningful to me is that it shows the amount of hours I've put in beyond the actual duties of my job."

Every two years, the award honors an individual who has shown throughout his or her career the ability to enrich the lives of students in the field of music. Also, the award recognizes dedication to the professional organizations devoted to the advancement of music education.

"Dr. Stone is a well-known figure in the music community," said Scott Barkhurst, one of Stone's colleagues in the music school. "He is also a wonderful person who is much deserving of such an

honor."

Stone taught for more than 20 years in Oregon public schools before joining the University music faculty in 1976. During his long, successful music teaching career, he instructed extensively in the fields of jazz history, choral singing and popular music. Stone has written several articles on popular music for a variety of music publications and worked to produce *Jazz Songbook*, a series of weekly programs for public radio in Oregon.

Aside from teaching, Stone has excelled in the arena of Oregon music administration. He is a past president of the Music Educators National Conference and the Oregon Music Educators Association and has served on committees for both organizations. Stone also served as an evaluator of music education programs for several national and state music commissions.

Stone is also an accomplished professional trombone player, who performs regularly with the Starlighters, a local big band jazz ensemble.

## Kidnapped girl returns to family

DELANO, Calif. (AP) — A 4-month-old girl kidnapped a week ago from an Orange County mall was found safe Saturday at a home in Delano, Costa Mesa police said.

Stephanie Zamora was kidnapped from a Sears store at South Coast Plaza in Costa Mesa on April 22 by a woman whom police identified as Maria Louisa Martinez, 36, of Delano.

On Friday, an informant led detectives from the Delano and Costa Mesa police departments to a Delano home, about 110 miles northeast of Los Angeles. Police staked out the house and when Martinez left at 10 a.m. Saturday, she was arrested, said Costa Mesa police officer Wayne Riedmann.

Detectives searched the house and found the baby on a back patio with other children and adults, he said.

"These people cooperated with detectives and said the suspect did not have a car or child 10 days ago," Riedmann said.

Martinez was returned to Orange County to face kidnapping and grand theft auto charges, police said.

## City government plans to reach citizens on-line

SALEM (AP) — City officials looking to boost citizen involvement in local government have found a new avenue: the Internet.

The proposed Oregon Public Electronic Network would allow residents to use their home computers to talk to city officials and access information about city and county government, the library system and schools.

"What we're offering is an easy way for them to get involved," said Ken Phillips, who is spearheading the project. "This is something that's going to bring this community together."

Electronic forums will allow citizens to discuss local issues. They'll see an on-screen map of the proposed riverfront park and be able to comment on it. They'll see the previous city council minutes. The system will be computerized, so anyone can join in the electronic-mail debate at any time.

"There's really no limit to what we can do once it gets started," Phillips said.

Marion County has committed \$60,000 to the project, and Salem's \$30,000 share is scheduled for approval next month. A federal library grant and subscription fees would cover the rest of the first-year costs.

"We don't want to make a profit on this," Phillips said. "We see it as a public utility, like streets or lighting. The difference is that only people who use the system will be paying for it."

For \$5 a month, OPEN subscribers will get an e-mail account and full access to the Internet.
