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package. I think I've reached the point where I could go forward and be successful."

Frazier is already successful in track and field, serving his second term as vice-president of USA Track and Field and acting administratively for the USA team in the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta.

The former Olympian's ideas on Oregon include sustaining current athletic teams and using resources to keep the teams competitive in the Pac-10 and the nation.

"When you're winning, you're okay," he said, "but when you're not, you're a bum."

Coming from a certified institution, Frazier is aware of Title IX responsibilities. He said it is Oregon's duty to maintain compliance in front of the gender-equity curve on a national level and not behind it.

The Decision: Dan Williams, Oregon's vice president of administration and interim athletics director, said the selection committee for the athletics director will reconvene on May 9 or 10.

The committee will give its reactions to all four candidates

and then Williams will make the hiring decision after talking to Dave Frohnmayer, University president. The announcement of the new athletics director should follow shortly after that final meeting.

Williams said he was delighted with all four finalists, adding that the harder the decision is, the less likely it is to make a mistake.

"I can't imagine any school in the country could have four finalists this qualified," Williams said. "It's obvious they can all do the job. The question is, which person will be the best fit for the University of Oregon?"

Besides Frazier, the other finalists interviewed for the Oregon post are Dr. Eve Atkinson, athletics director at Lafayette College in Easton, Pa., Bill Moos, athletics director at the University of Montana in Missoula, Mont., and Gary Cunningham, athletics director at Fresno State University in Fresno, Calif.

Oregon has been without a full-time athletics director since Bill Byrne left for Nebraska in September 1992. Williams has served as AD in addition to his other administrative duties since last August when Rich Brooks relinquished his part-time athletics-director post to devote his attention solely to the Ducks' football team.

With a pair of wins over the Beavers, Oregon could reach the .500 plateau once again. Oregon State has not picked up a victory in nearly a month.

Oregon State (11-33, 2-16) has seen its season go from average to horrifying by dropping 12 straight decisions since April 10. However, Brown still wants her team to take the Beavers seriously.
