

Search for UW president costly

SEATTLE (AP) — The search for a new president at the University of Washington has cost nearly \$100,000 in state funds, records show.

The university had already spent \$51,507 by March, which does not include the \$45,000 the school will pay its second search consultant.

The search, entering its second year this week, was restarted last month after the leading candidate accepted another university presidency. An 18-member search committee is expected to continue looking through the summer.

Most of the money paid so far went to the UW's first consulting firm, Academic Search Consultation Service of Washington, D.C. It received \$32,000 plus expenses, The News Tribune of Tacoma reported Tuesday.

The UW Board of Regents hired another consultant, A.T. Kearney Inc. of Chicago, to do another national search for \$45,000. The contract is to be

paid in three installments, plus expenses.

Together, the UW's two consultants are being paid \$77,000 of the \$96,507 committed so far.

Other miscellaneous expenses included \$7,847 to advertise the job in at least one national publication. In addition, money was spent to rent building space and for travel, freight and mailing costs.

More bills are expected, as not all candidates interviewed during the first search have turned in their expenses for airfare, hotel and rental cars, a UW official said.

The university released its budget records Monday after they were requested by The News Tribune, The Seattle Times and the Seattle Post-Intelligencer.

A list of nearly 40 candidates is to be narrowed down to about a dozen this week. Regents and search-committee members probably will start interviewing candidates then.

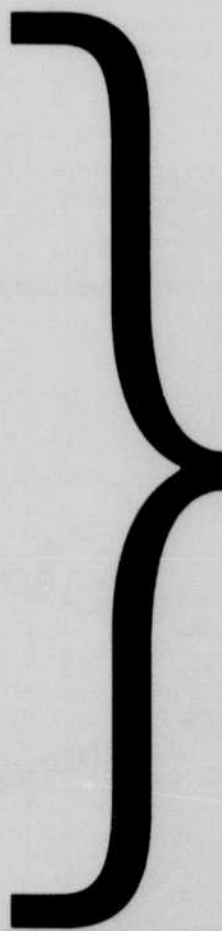

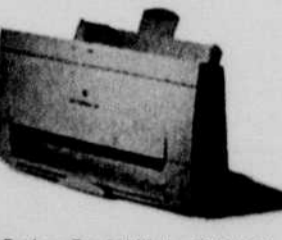
