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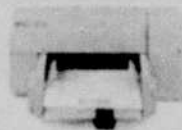

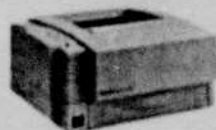

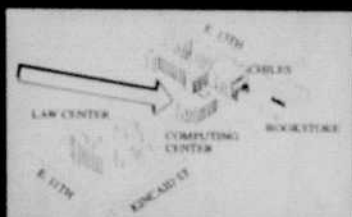

Ryan to sing blues, show soul

After hearing Walker T. Ryan perform, veteran blues performer Dave VanRunk said, "That boy's got a soul of his own."

Gavin Fox, better known as KLCC's "Roosterman," names Ryan "a Northwest treasure." And *The Register Guard* continued these high praises when it listed Ryan as one of only three solo acts in its musical "Top 20 In Town" for 1993.

But there is more to Walker T. Ryan than excelling at the blues. He is also an accomplished songwriter, and was a winner in the 1991 songwriting competition at the Willamette Valley Folk Festival.

Ryan will return to the folk festival this year; but he will perform, not compete, this time. Ryan will perform Saturday, May 20 on the festival's main stage at 3 p.m.

Later in the day he will present a workshop titled "Songwriting and the Blues." In it, Ryan will discuss songwriting and the various themes of the blues.

Ryan is a dynamic and engaging performer who is full of stories, anecdotes and tall tales. The passion he brings to his music is intense and honest. His willingness and desire to teach people about the history and truths of the music he plays, and what the blues has taught him, is unique.

Part of what makes Walker so unique is the life he has lived outside his music and what he brings to his work. His father was an

actor, his mother a writer. Ryan himself has been a movie and stage actor, a horse wrangler, camp counselor, telephone salesman, carpenter and clown. For more than 10 years he spent his summers as a white water river guide in Washington and

Oregon.

Since arriving in the Northwest six years ago, Ryan has opened for such nationally-known artists as Taj Mahal, Hot Tuna, David Bromberg, John Sebastian and Steppenwolf.
