

Devils heat up Pittsburgh's Igloo to tie series, 1-1

PITTSBURGH (AP) — The New Jersey Devils felt they should have left Pittsburgh leading 2-0 in their NHL playoff series. If it weren't for Scott Stevens and a bounce that finally went their way, they might be down 0-2.

Stevens' backhander from the slot off his own rebound with 29 seconds left prevented another third-period New Jersey collapse and the Devils beat the Penguins 4-2 Monday night, tying their Eastern Conference semifinal series at a game apiece.

The Devils, 0-2-2 previously against the Penguins this season, outplayed Pittsburgh at both ends — just as they did in losing 3-2 in Game 1 — to seize home-ice advantage.

Claude Lemieux scored twice, including an empty-netter with a second left, as the Devils got back on their game with tight checking and mid-ice traps to neutralize all of Pittsburgh's big scorers except Jaromir Jagr. Jagr scored twice,

including a tying goal with 1:15 remaining that threatened to send the game into overtime.

"The guys were down after that goal," Devils coach Jacques Lemaire said. "Only a couple of guys said, 'Hey, we worked hard and we only need one goal.'"

One of them was Stevens, who jumped on his own missed slap shot, took goaltender Ken Wregget off his skates by faking a shot from the lower left circle and flicked the puck into an unprotected net.

"There wasn't much time, so I just wanted to put a shot on the net and I hoped one of our forwards would go in and pick up the rebound," Stevens said. "The way it rebounded, it was almost like I passed it to myself. I just went to my backhand and slid it on the ice."

New Jersey outshot Pittsburgh 2-to-1 for most of the game, and led 2-1 on Lemieux's goal at 7:49 of the third before Jagr tied it at 18:45, flicking a shot off defenseman Tommy Albelin's skate and

by goaltender Martin Brodeur.

Jagr's goal was reminiscent of Luc Robitaille's game-winner with 1:16 remaining in Game 1 as the Devils outplayed the Penguins, only to lose on a bad line change that left Robitaille unprotected.

"The momentum swing could have been devastating," the Devils' Ken Daneyko said. "We knew that (Jagr's goal) was nothing but a lucky bounce. I said on the bench, 'We won't be denied, if we go out there with a drive and intensity.'"

Penguins coach Eddie Johnston thought it would last longer than that.

"Yes, it was a strange finish," he said. "If we had gotten it into overtime, we would've felt very comfortable. It's not too often you see two goals like that in the final minute of a playoff hockey game."

Flyers 4, N.Y. Rangers 3, OT
PHILADELPHIA (AP) — A trade with

the Montreal Canadiens during the season continues to pay playoff dividends for the Philadelphia Flyers.

For the second day in a row, a defenseman that Flyers general manager Bobby Clarke obtained in a deal with Montreal helped Philadelphia beat the New York Rangers.

This time, it was Kevin Haller, whose 15-foot wrist shot 25 seconds into overtime gave the Flyers a 4-3 victory Monday night over the Rangers and a 2-0 lead in their best-of-7 Eastern Conference semifinal.

On Sunday, it was Eric Desjardins whose goal at 7:03 of the extra session gave Philadelphia a 5-4 victory.

Haller, describing the first overtime game-winner of his career, said the ice opened up in front of him as he watched Mikael Renberg carry the puck into the Rangers' zone.

"If it's open, you have to go," he said. "And it was wide open. It surprised me."

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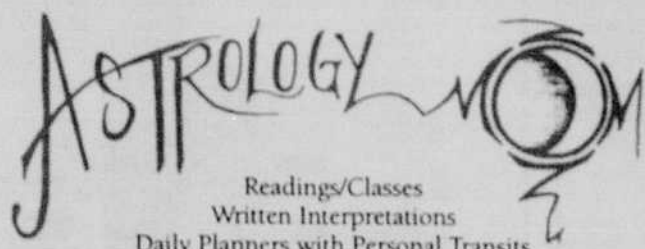
