Camara Jones won both the

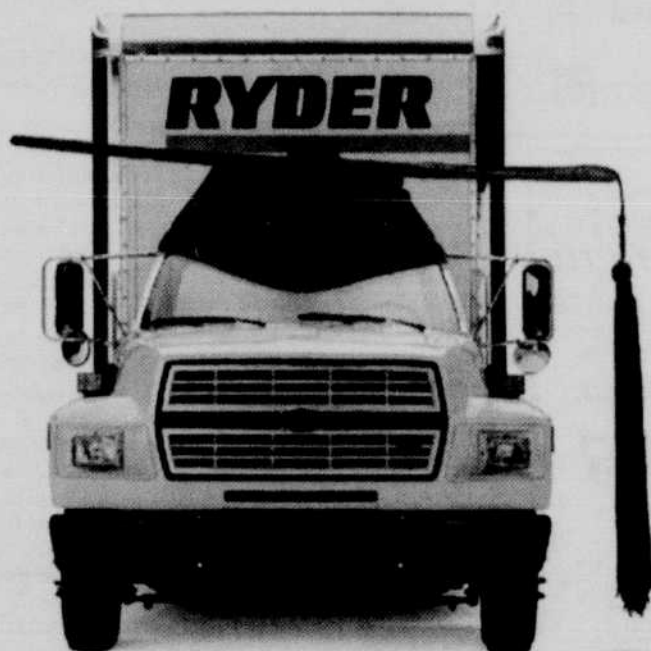
