net electronic communication system.

In a change from previous executives, Williamson and Kelton have divided the responsibilities of the ASUO Executive's top positions, arranging a co-presidency of sorts.

"We'll be using the title president and vice president, but we're both going to be able to speak for the Executive," Kelton said.

They have adopted a team approach to the ASUO Executive, both oversee half of the staff. The team has signed up for regular mediation sessions next fall.

"We did that because we realize that we're going to be working so closely together," Kelton said. "A lot of times small disagreements can escalate into bigger problems when you're working so closely together. Even though there's no problem now, we recognize the potential."

The two are working to increase student representation on several key University bodies. They will sit on the board of directors of the Oregon Student Lobby where they will look at how legislative policies affect state schools.

Also, in the wake of the recent resignation of Gerry Moseley, the University's vice provost for academic support and student services, Williamson and Kelton lobbied to sit on the committee that will review interim decisions regarding Moseley's position.

"This creates a real opportunity to reexamine the way services are delivered in Oregon Hall," Kelton said.

Another area of concern for the pair is the recent reorganiza-

tion of University governance, specifically the reduction of student representatives on the University Senate.

The original proposal for the revised Senate called for nine students on the governing body, but administrators approved a version allowing only five students. In retaliation, the Student Senate approved changes in the ASUO constitution that allow students to boycott the University Senate and bar faculty members from University programs funded by student fees.

Williamson and Kelton are disappointed by the University Senate's action to reduce the number of student representations, but they are even more disappointed by the Student Senate's reaction.

"[The Student Senate] made a political statement," Kelton said. "They're upset, as are we, that the faculty would choose to reduce the number of students on what is going to be an increasingly powerful body in University governance."

"There are other ways to show our disappointment with the faculty. I don't think that's the best way," Williamson said.

The two said they don't want to polarize the students and the faculty by inflaming and infuriating the faculty. Instead they advocate education.

"We want to work with the faculty to make them understand that students are a very important voice at this University and that they need to have a role in University governance," Kelton said.

He said all it will take is to convince one faculty member who voted with the majority in the assembly to motion to reconsider the decision. If the new University Senate system is not changed, it will take effect Jan. 1, 1996.
