joins the Ducks' staff following one season as associate men's head coach at Northwestern State (La.) and head coach at Western State College (Colo.) a year ago.

"I feel very fortunate to be able to attract someone with the wealth of experience that Fred brings to the game," Runge said. "He is the best teacher of basketball I've ever been around and is someone I believe will be able to relate very well to our players as well as our style of play."

It was during his stay at Colorado State that he and Runge first crossed paths, when Runge served as the Rams' women's basketball assistant during the 1988-89 season.

"The fact that I've known Jody for a number of years," Litzenger said, and "the outstanding basketball program she has built there, as well as the excellence of the entire University, all combined to make this opportunity one I couldn't pass up."

In 12 seasons as a head coach at all levels, Litzenger has posted an overall coaching record of 194-62.

Based on descriptions provided by the victims, three young men were identified and arrested later outside a party at 531 E. 14th Ave.

The police recovered the cash, property, a loaded handgun and ammunition from the suspects.

Two of the suspects, one 15 and the other 16, were charged with robbery, conspiracy and unauthorized departure.

The 17-year-old was charged with robbery, conspiracy and unlawful possession of a weapon.

The suspects are being held at Skipworth Juvenile Detention Facility.

"This is the first armed robbery I can remember in four years," said Carey Drayton, director of public safety for the

University. "We've had robberies before, but not any where a gun was used."

In 1993, only three robberies were reported, according to the Office of Public Safety.

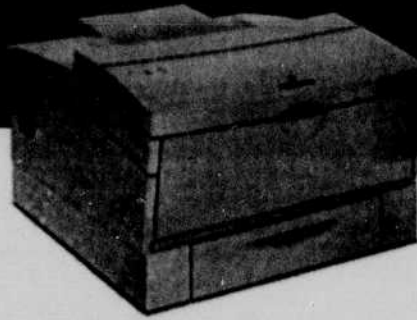
"Everyone was surprised about the robbery," said James Williams, the officer on duty the night of the incident. "It's very hard to tell who's a student and who's a teen-ager."

Drayton agreed with Williams' concern about delinquent teen-agers at the University.

"It's very hard to prevent this type of incident because the campus is open to non-students — it's a public institution," Drayton said. "The campus is not a sanctuary from criminals."

"Crime is an issue everyone has to deal with," he said. "Whatever you do at home to protect your safety, you need to do that here on campus."

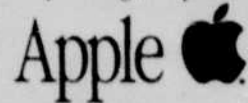

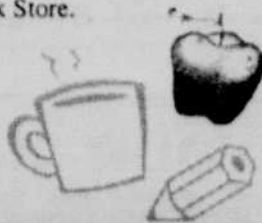
