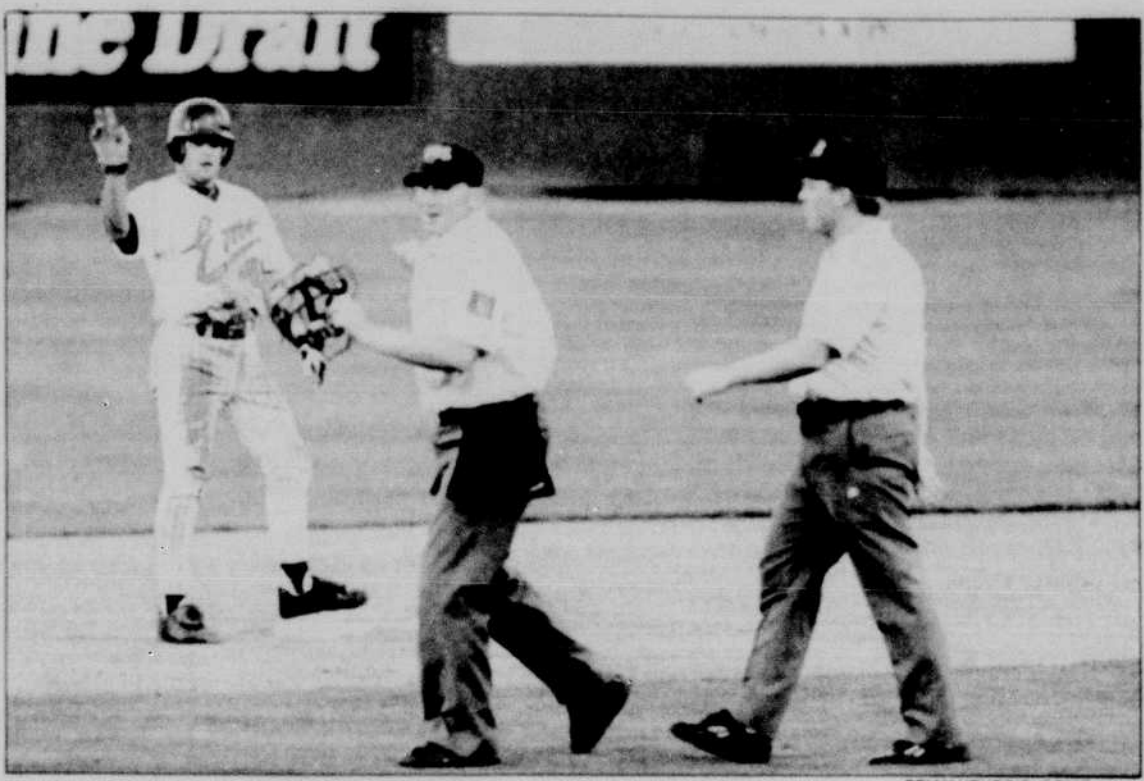

Hodges' heroics lead to win

Monday night's fans in attendance at Civic Stadium saw a game that had it all — ground balls and fly balls, walks and steals, strikeouts and hit batsmen, bunts and a home run and errors — as the Eugene Emeralds upended visiting Spokane in the bottom of the ninth inning, 4-3.

The game's starting pitchers, Eugene's Jose Garcia (1-1) and Spokane's Hal Hodge (1-0) were long forgotten as the deciding factors of the game came into play

in the latter innings.

As the eighth inning began, everything seemingly was going smoothly for the home team — the Ems were holding a 3-1 lead — but then the error demon struck with two outs and runners on first and third. Spokane first baseman James Vida ripped what would have been an RBI single toward Ems right fielder Sherton Saturnino and motored around to third as Saturnino overran the ball and let it roll to the wall, tying the game 3-3.

An inning and two-thirds

passed with neither team breaking the tie. In the bottom of the ninth, Ems' second baseman Randy Hodges stepped up to the plate with Brian Rust at first and one out. Hodges abruptly batted his second double and third hit of the night, bringing in the winning run.

"It's a big relief," outfielder Joe Trippy said. "Instead of losing in the ninth, we finally won it."

The win ended a three-game slide and improved the Ems' record to 3-9.

Johnson commits to play football again

Oregon two-sport standout Pat Johnson has decided to play football for the Ducks during the 1995 season, head football coach Mike Bellotti announced last week.

The two-time NCAA track and field all-American and Pacific-10 Conference 400-meter champion was excused from participating in this year's spring football drills to concentrate on his exploits on the track.

Johnson placed eighth in the national collegiate 100 meters before reaching the semifinals in both the 200 and 400 earlier this month at the USA Track & Field Championships in Sacramento,

Calif., fueling speculation he may choose to sit out the coming football campaign in order to train for the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta.

"I'm very proud and pleased with Pat's performance, both as a football and a track standout," Bellotti said. "He will have the opportunity to contribute even more to our football team this year than he did last season. We will continue to support his dual-sport career at the University of Oregon in every way we can, including his Olympic aspirations."

The freshman wide receiver established the school's single-season record for receptions with 30 catches for 472 yards and two touchdowns a year ago.
