Art and the Vineyard opens Saturday

The Twelfth Annual Art and the Vineyard benefit for the Maude Kerns Art Center takes place July 1, 2 and 3 in Alton Baker Park from 11 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. daily.

The festival offers live music, an international food court, 12 wineries and a multitude of art exhibits.

Herb Price, coordinator of Art and the Vineyard, said a Public Mural highlights this year's festival. By painting a part of the mural people can "leave your mark on the festival," Price said.

The various art exhibits consist of Art for Your Garden, Children's Art Arena, Sculpture Park and the Artists' Marketplace.

The Artists' Marketplace highlights the work of Northwest artists. More than 100 artists are expected to sell their work.

The South Willamette Winegrowers Association offers component tasting again this year, which provides novices and experts the chance to taste the differences between sweetness, acidity or proportion of local wines.

Price said, "The event is an important one because it provides a major source of funds."

Active 20/30 Club Fireworks Show

The 49th Annual Active 20/30 Club Fireworks Show and Celebration at Autzen Stadium begins at 3:30 p.m. on Tuesday July 4th.

Activities include entertainment geared to the whole family and features various bands playing from 4 to 7 p.m. The bands include Unshakable Race, Storm Chasers and the Revelators. Beginning at 8:30 p.m., the Eugene Symphony Band plays a program of patriotic music.

The fireworks display, which begins at approximately 9:30 p.m., is the largest in the area and lasts nearly one hour.

The lot at Autzen Stadium opens at 3 p.m. and parking is \$5 per car. No bottles or cans are allowed inside and viewers are reminded the best way to see the show is from inside the stadium.

Baseball and fireworks go together like birds of a feather. The Eugene Emeralds play against the Boise Hawks at Civic Stadium (2077 Willamette St.) on Tuesday July 4.
