## Lombard powers Eugene again

■ **BASEBALL:** Ems jump out of cellar behind Lombard's continued success at the plate

The Eugene Emeralds found themselves napping no longer Tuesday night, blowing away the Southern Oregon Athletics 10-1 behind another monster performance from outfielder George Lombard.

After missing three games due to personal reasons, Lombard drove in three runs on four hits, including a two-run homer and an RBI triple.

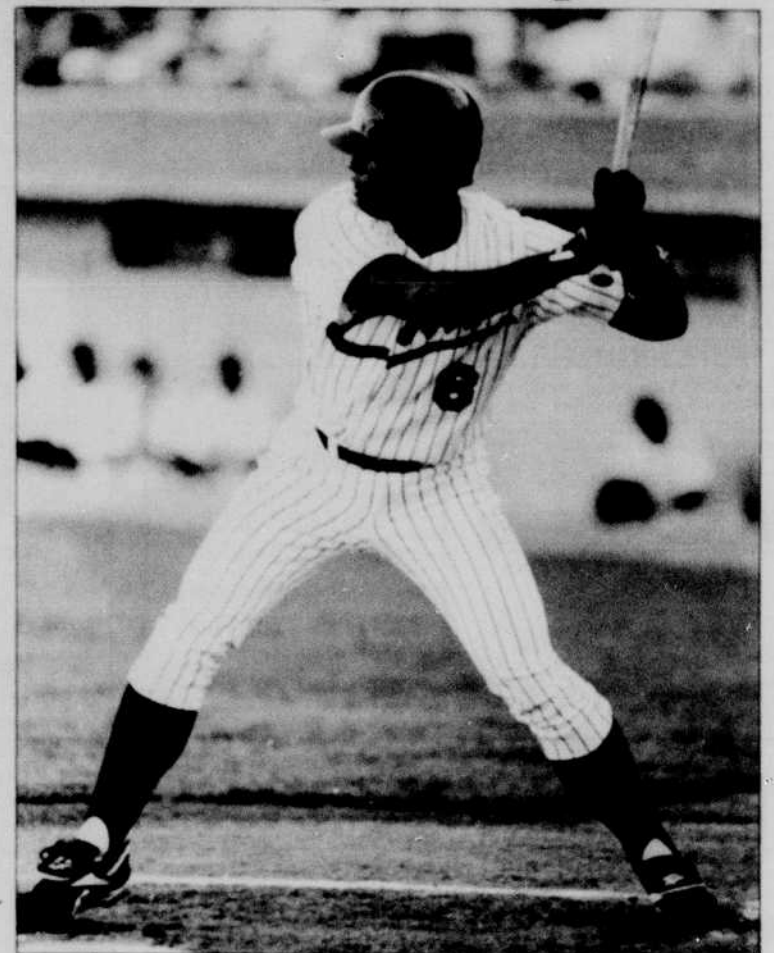
The win snapped a three-game losing streak for the Ems (23-29), moving them out of the cellar and one half-game ahead of the Athletics (22-29).

Lombard has had a tough time most of the season at the plate, with a batting average hovering around the .200 mark. Prior to Tuesday's game, Lombard had a career night during his last appearance, hitting his first professional home run — a grand slam — and driving in a total of six RBI in another rout of the A's.

Lombard and company will try to put it to the A's once again in the series finale tonight in Medford.

After holding the top spot in the Southern Division for the majority of the season, the Portland Rockies have fallen prey to

the Boise Hawks, dropping to 1½ games behind.

The Hawks entered the five-game series in Portland one half-game behind the Rockies and wasted no time in taking over the division lead with a 7-1 vic-

tory Monday night. Boise used a 10-hit attack to beat Portland for the third game in a row between the two teams.

The following night, the Hawks beat the Rockies 4-3, to take a 2-0 lead in the series.

## Mantle's condition: 'In big trouble'

■ **CANCER:** The former Yankee great's health is deteriorating

DALLAS (AP) — Mickey Mantle took a drastic turn for the worse today with the discovery that his cancer has spread beyond his liver and right lung.

Mantle, 63, remained hospitalized at Baylor University Medical Center where he has been since July 28. His condition deteriorated from stable to serious.

At Mantle's request, doctors would not talk about his case. The hospital said no news conferences were scheduled to discuss his condition.

"Mr. Mantle is spending time with his family and wants his friends to know he continues to fight," the hospital said in a statement.

Dr. Isaac Djerassi, a research oncologist at Mercy Catholic Medical Center, flew to Dallas from Philadelphia late last week to examine the Hall of Famer.

He said he agreed to not discuss specifics of the case.

"But this particular cancer can go anywhere ... usually the lungs, the abdomen and sometimes the bones," he said today. "It just makes it clear that he's in big trouble. It's not important where it is."

Mantle's gastroenterologist, Dr. Daniel DeMarco, said last week that doctors were afraid the disease may spread. Mantle had been receiving chemotherapy since undergoing a transplant on June 8 to replace his liver, which had been eroded by cancer, hepatitis C and cirrhosis.

The former New York Yankees great went into Baylor this

time because of complications from the chemotherapy used to fight several spots of cancer that had migrated to his right lung from the diseased liver. He announced that discovery on Aug. 1 via a taped television message.

Mantle's health has been rapidly deteriorating for months. He entered Baylor on May 28 complaining of stomach pains and received a liver transplant within weeks.

Doctors said they wouldn't have replaced the organ had they known the cancer already had spread, but weeks later they discovered it in his lungs.

At a July 11 news conference, Mantle looked gaunt and frail, although he displayed a sharp wit. Alluding to his years of drinking, Mantle advised children, "Here's a role model: don't be like me."
