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Frohnmayer: 'It's nice to feel settled'

surmounted. As a reality check, the summer was well spent."

Q. How does it feel to be the University's newly chosen president?

A. It has brought on a new level of certainty and stability both to my life and the University's. Obviously, it's a great challenge and a great privilege. That sense of stability will enable us to go forward with much longer-range planning that I hope will give people a sense of continuity and leadership in the institution. It's nice to feel settled and to make plans for more than a year or two in advance. Now I can develop a longer range vision about this institution and how to make it even better."

Q. What changes or improvements can students expect to see from your presidency this year?

A. Students can definitely expect to see more technology. They will see five new refurbished technologically advanced classrooms that weren't here last year. They'll continue to see attention in renewed and creative ways to improve undergraduate education. Beyond that, we feel a profound obligation to make the undergraduate experience as meaningful, exciting and memorable as possible. Their education is more than hours spent in a classroom; it's a whole social environment. It should be intellectually and technologically stimulating and our hope is to make it real with the whole student and not just the student who appears in a seminar, lab or workshop."

Q. What are some campus issues you plan to focus on?

A. There are many things on my agenda. We have a new governance system that we need to initiate and make work. For the third year in a row we're favored with some very creative and talented leadership in the associated students and I look forward to working with them. This will be an active year with

student-administration and student-faculty cooperation. We'll be focusing on more outreach into the community, not just outreach within the campus. Ongoing safety issues will continue to be addressed so that this University is not only perceived as a safe campus, but is a safe campus."

Q. In looking at this year's four percent tuition increase, what efforts are being made to keep future increases at a minimum?

A. Our hope at this time, depending on lottery projections, is that there won't be any tuition increase next year. If the proceeds hold, the objective is to buy down the tuition to zero. If enrollment increases next year, that could also help keep it down, but it will take vigorous recruitment and retention of existing students to make that happen."

Q. Are there more students enrolled this year than last, and what is being done to bring more students to the University in general?

A. Although we won't know until October, we have every reason to believe enrollment has increased slightly. We will continue to recruit aggressively in both Oregon and out of state in markets where people express an interest to the University. We have nearly 100 faculty that phone students individually in recruiting efforts right now. This is a tremendous statement of dedication by faculty to the future of the University when they are willing to spend their own time — without anything but the grateful thanks of deans and administrators — to call up students and let them know there is a personal touch here."

Q. What other changes or activities can students expect to see in terms of improving the overall stability of the University's future?

A. We will be working with the other OSSHE institutions to cultivate a greater support from a wide variety of

constituencies in Oregon. Here at home, we plan to continue working on the Oregon Campaign. We are now halfway to our goal of \$150 million and six months ahead of schedule. The campaign is an investment in students and faculty in terms of student scholarships and faculty support. By the end of the century we will have more than 18,000 students here, and the need for expansion will be strong. I think in the short run, we will have to find a way to have more updated, adequate classroom and auditorium facilities at or near campus to accommodate this growth."

Q. And for the question that all Duck fans want to know, what's your prediction on Gang Green making it to the big one two years in a row?

A. I'll say now what I said last year when Rich Brooks unexpectedly asked me to speak to the team. I said, "You have great material and if you listen to your coaches and work hard, you'll go to a bowl." We have the material, the coaches and the talent again this year, so now it's just up to the team to put themselves together and make it happen again."

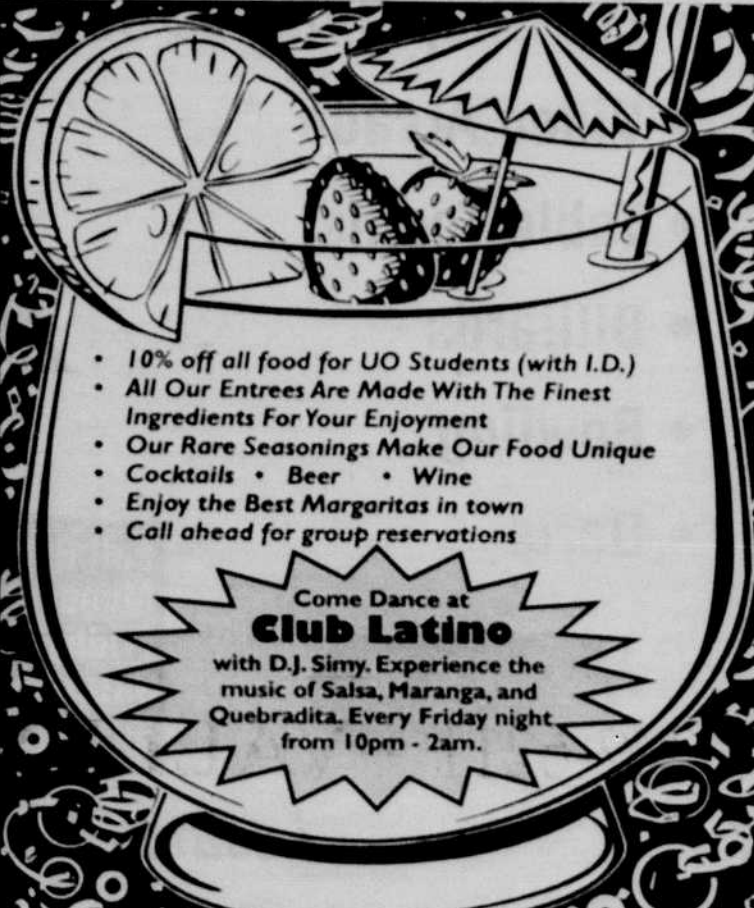
