NASA collects data from Columbian Basin that resembles Mars



MOSES LAKE, Wash. (AP) — Does the Columbia Basin look like Mars?

Scientists from the National Aeronautical and Space Administration think so — so much so that NASA is participating in a geological survey in Washington to gather data for a Mars landing mission slated for 1997.

In cooperation with Arizona State University, the Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, Calif., and the Lunar/Planetary Institute in Houston, NASA is co-sponsoring a team of scientists and 12 educators from Washington and Idaho to participate in the survey.

The study will bring together Mars scientists and engineers from around the world to collect data for the landing of the Mars Pathfinder spacecraft on July 4, 1997. The landing will take place near a giant flood channel called Ares Vallis on Mars that closely resembles the channeled scabland in the Columbia Basin. Some geologists believe as many as 80 floods poured through the region more than 13,000 years ago.

Columbia Basin Aviation will fly a television crew from the Public Broadcasting System around the study site, which will be filmed as part of a PBS documentary.

Federal jury convicts ten Muslim radicals of conspiracy to bomb



NEW YORK (AP) — A federal jury on Sunday convicted 10 Muslim radicals, including Sheikh Omar Abdel-Rahman, of conspiring to bomb the United Nations, a bridge and tunnels to frighten the United States into changing its Middle East policies.

The jury also convicted one of the defendants, El Sayyid Nosair, in the 1990 killing of extremist Rabbi Meir Kahane, an assassination once described as an isolated attack by a crazed gunman but later as the opening blow in a "war of urban terrorism."

Security around the courthouse was increased immediately after the verdict, with uniformed police joining dozens of U.S. marshals. Stewart said the sheik would be moved quickly to a prison hospital out of concern for his health problems, which include diabetes and heart trouble.

Besides seditious conspiracy, the defendants faced various lesser charges. Nosair and Ibrahim El-Gabrowni each were found innocent of a direct role in the plot to bomb New York City landmarks but were convicted of the broader seditious conspiracy charge.

The sheik and Nosair face life in prison. The rest face 20 to 30 years.

Israeli troops pull out of West Bank under protest from civilians



JERUSALEM (AP) — After 28 years of occupation, Israel will start withdrawing troops and shutting down the offices of its military government in the West Bank this month, Foreign Minister Shimon Peres said Sunday.

The impending transfer of power set off protests among Jewish settlers, who accused the Israeli government of abandoning them. Peres, speaking to The Associated Press by telephone from New York, said the troop withdrawal from the West Bank would probably begin "in several weeks."

He said Israel also would shut down the 12 offices of its military government in the West Bank. Shlomo Dror, a spokesman for the military government, said the first four offices would be closed next week, and the others within six months.

Peres repeated Israel's intention to have its troops out of six West Bank towns by the end of the year.

This was part of a compromise worked out between Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin and PLO chief Yasser Arafat just before they signed an accord Thursday in Washington on expanding Palestinian autonomy in the West Bank.

Israel has until March 30 to

redeploy troops in the seventh city, Hebron, where 450 Jewish settlers live among 120,000 Palestinians.

The transfer of power in cities and villages will give the Palestinians control over almost a third of the West Bank, which Israel captured from Jordan in the 1967 Mideast War.

The Israel-PLO agreement faces stiff opposition from Jewish settlers in the West Bank. About 200 settlers burned tires and blocked traffic Sunday morning on the bypass road around Jericho and at an army checkpoint before the Allenby Bridge to Jordan. Eighteen protesters were detained.

Quake shakes western Turkey killing 14, burying dozens

ISTANBUL, Turkey (AP) — An earthquake with a preliminary magnitude of 6.0 shook western Turkey on Sunday, killing at least 14 people and leaving dozens more buried under the rubble of collapsed buildings.

Public Works Minister Halil Culhaoglu said the death toll could reach 100.

Two-thirds of the buildings collapsed in Dinar, a city of 100,000 people near the quake's epicenter.

The semi-official Anatolia news agency reported 14 people were killed and at least 193 were injured. Rescue teams were trying to clear the rubble with heavy machines.
