As a result of the field study, two students have come to Eugene specifically to try to get into the program, he said.

Pinyard attributes the low turnout from the University to a lack of advertising on campus. Most advertising was national, and as a result, people from across the country enrolled in the field study, he said.

The field study was worth

four credits for each session, and it was financially self-supported, he said. Each session cost \$592 for graduate students and \$420 for undergraduates.

State and federal agencies collaborated with the preservation program to make the field study possible, Pinyard said. The Oregon State Parks and Recreation Department, the Oregon State Historic Preservation Office, the Oregon

Historical Society, the U.S. Forest Service and the National Park Service provided plans, instructions and helped with the restoration.

The field study proved to be such a success that Peting wants to offer others.

"We expect to have a second one," he said. "We have talked about having the program at the coast next year."
