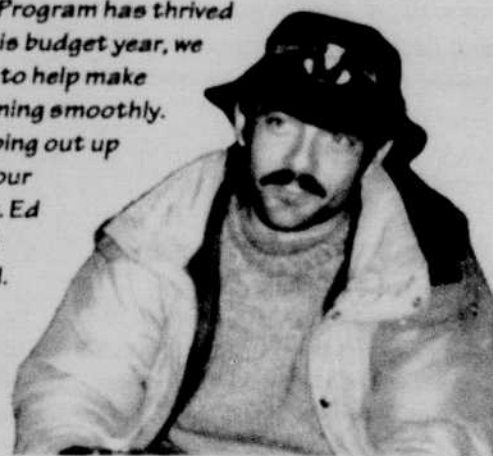

It contains descriptions and directions to 61 exciting and scenic mountain bike routes. The routes range from easy for the family or novice to extreme rides that will challenge the most advanced rider. The 144 page book also covers equipment, minimum impact techniques, overview maps and photos.
