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based on the limited description, the possibility of capturing him is slim.

"It's very possible, but not likely to catch this guy," he said. "It's possible if this guy continues to commit this type of crime."

The victim, a freshman from out of state, has withdrawn from the University.

"The victim didn't say she withdrew from the University as a result of the attack, but we're assuming that's why," Poppe said.

After talking to counselors at the Student Health Center and her resident director, the student reported the incident to Eugene police on Saturday morning. Poppe stated the victim had said she was reluctant to report the incident because she was in shock.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

- In situations involving drugs and alcohol, monitor yourself and those around you. Make sure you have a trustworthy friend, so you are not alone in a situation that could become potentially dangerous.
- Avoid dangerous situations, such as walking, studying, biking and exercising alone, especially after dark.
- Exercise caution when dealing with strangers.
- Wearing headphones prevents hearing what is going on around you.
- Use recognized safety resources such as Saferide and the University's Office of Public Safety to transport students home.
- Saferide is available to transport women from 6 p.m. to midnight Sunday through Thursday and until 2:00 a.m. Friday and Saturday. Women can call the Saferide reservation line at 346-4239 during the day and leave a message and confirm the ride after 5:30 p.m.
- The OPS office offers transportation to men and women who feel unsafe. You can call OPS at 346-5444, 24 hours a day for an escort service home. OPS will take students within a few blocks of campus.
