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## Committee hosts final fund-raiser for Xora Xoc

The Committee in Solidarity  
with the Central American Peo-  
ple sponsored its third and final  
fund-raising dinner for the year  
Sunday at Cafe Navarro.

The dinner featured  
Guatemalan cuisine, and funds  
raised will go to two organiza-  
tions: CONAVIGUA, the Nation-  
al Coordinating Group of  
Guatemalan widows and the high-  
land village of Xora Xoc. This vil-  
lage's men were massacred, and  
the women have organized in  
order to sustain their community.

Phoebe Durland, a senior at the  
University, helped organize the  
fundraiser because of her expe-  
rience living in Xora Xoc last  
winter.

"They asked what is possible  
for me to do," Durland said. "I  
don't have any money, but I live  
in an American town that is pro-  
gressive, so I figured I could do  
something in Eugene."

Durland lived with an Indian  
family, and also helped in the vil-  
lage school.

"They don't have any teachers,  
and that is something I would  
also like to continue to help  
with," Durland said.

The funds for CONAVIGUA  
are being handled by Nisgua,  
which deals with 14 organiza-  
tions in Guatemala and has a con-  
tact in Eugene. Durland plans to  
take the rest of the monies raised  
directly to Xora Xoc herself.

In addition to the dinner, pho-  
tos from Xora Xoc are on display  
and for sale at Cafe Navarro  
through the end of October. The  
proceeds will go to Xora Xoc.

Durland said she was "very  
pleased" with the turnout for the  
fund-raising dinner. Some people  
waited up to 20 minutes for a table.

CISCAP's next fund-raising  
project is their Fall Campaign,  
which includes a Work-a-Thon.  
Pledges will be taken for com-  
munity service work done in the  
Eugene-Springfield area and  
monies raised will go toward  
material aid for programs in El  
Salvador and Guatemala.

A free presentation on organic  
farming in Cuba is also scheduled

p.m. at the First Methodist
