Seattle's Payton could be a daddy

SONICS: A Chicago woman alleges the former Oregon State guard is the father of her son.

SEATTLE (AP) — Seattle SuperSonics guard Gary Payton has gone to court in Chicago "to determine the paternity of a 3-year-old boy," his agent disclosed Thursday.

"The boy lives in Chicago with his mother," said the statement released by agent Eric Goodwin.

Payton said he has supported the child for 3 years and will

continue to do so if tests show he's the father.

The name of the woman and her son were not being disclosed, Goodwin said in a telephone interview.

"DNA tests have been taken by all parties involved and test results should be available within the next two weeks," the release said.

The tests were conducted two weeks ago, Goodwin said. The legal action was filed Thursday in Cook County, Ill., Circuit Court by Payton's attorneys.

"I have provided financially

for the child for the last three years," Payton said in the release.

"If the results show that I am the father, I am happy to assume my paternal responsibilities and to provide for the child in a fair and appropriate manner, keeping in mind his best interests."

A Sonics team spokesman declined comment.

Payton, 25, is unmarried.

He began his NBA career with the Sonics in 1990. He was a No. 2 overall draft choice out of Oregon State University and went to high school in Oakland.
