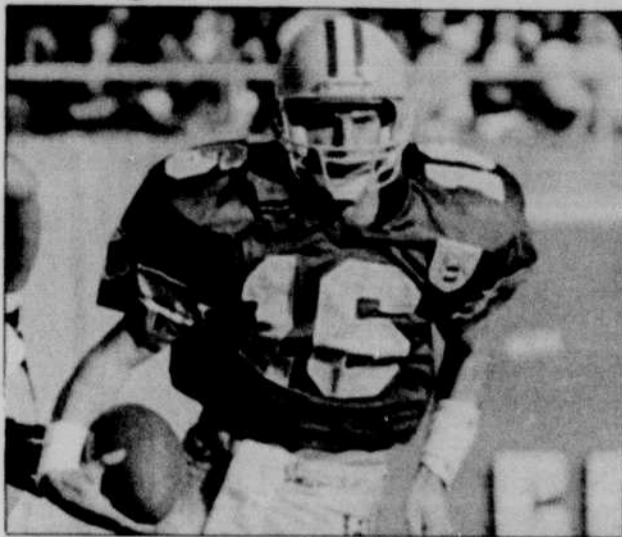

OREGON VS ARIZONA STATE

Oregon offense returned to form against the Devils in 1994

■ **RECAP:** Last year's game was the rebirth of Oregon's offensive dominance

Almost a year ago to the day, the Oregon football team laid a 34-10 spanking on the visiting Arizona State Sun Devils in what was billed as another crucial game in the Ducks' run for the roses and senior quarterback Danny O'Neil's final appearance at Autzen Stadium in 1994.

Entering the game, the Oregon offense had posted two less-than-impressive yardage numbers in near heart-stopping victories over nationally ranked Washington and Arizona the previous two weeks. Against the Huskies, the Ducks tallied only 123 yards through the air and 202 yards total offense. And the following week against the Wildcats, the offense increased their yardage output minimally to 233 yards total offense, 161 coming on the pass.

However, the Ducks wouldn't allow their offensive problems to go any further as O'Neil and the rest of the offense played a game to remember as they roared to 515 yards total offense in one of Oregon's most balanced attacks during Rich Brooks' tenure as head coach.

"Our offensive team played an outstanding game," said Oregon defensive coordinator Nick Aliotti (ODE, Nov. 7). "They carried our little rears to victory."

The defense didn't play too shabby either, holding the Devils to 87 yards rushing and 303 yards total offense in the Ducks' victory. Gang Green also snared Arizona State quarterback Jake Plummer four times for loss of yardage.

In the first quarter, Oregon streaked ahead 7-0 on a 67-yard carry by tailback Ricky Whittle. The Ducks held a 13-3 halftime lead over the Devils, but were not happy with only a 10-point margin. The Quack Attack took flight in the second half soaring away from the Devils.

"We wanted to make sure we got something done early in the third quarter," Brooks said (ODE, Nov. 7). "I thought our offense and defense really turned the dial up in the third quarter."

That they did, as the Ducks scored three touchdowns in the third quarter. Cristin McLemore's return at the flanker position made the offense more potent than ever. O'Neil hit McLemore for a 14-yard touchdown on one drive, he found freshman wide receiver Pat Johnson open
