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Ducks drop two in Washington

■ **VOLLEYBALL:** Oregon was unable to win on the road this season

The Oregon volleyball team could not find a way to win up north last weekend. They lost to Washington State in four games and got swept by Washington in three.

Oregon traveled to Seattle on Saturday night looking to beat the same Husky team they had swept in three games at home in October. But it was Washington's turn to do the sweeping — they won 15-5, 15-9, 15-4.

The Ducks had a slow night offensively. They hit .112 for the match, including a -.029 attack percentage in the third game. Junior outside hitter and team kills leader Amy McNeel was kept at two kills. Sophomore out-

side hitter Shelby Edwards had only three kills, and freshman middle blocker Allison White could only manage one kill.

Leading the Ducks was sophomore middle blocker Dani Cordova with 16 kills. Sophomore outside hitter Alison Pepe made 11 kills.

The Huskies used the attacks of Dragana Djordjevic, who had 15 kills, and Makare Desilets, who added nine kills, to beat the Ducks. Washington also had nine team blocks while Oregon could manage only two.

The Ducks also had trouble at the net on Friday night against Washington State. The Cougars had 14 team blocks while the Ducks had only three.

Although Oregon was able to take the first game from the Cougars 15-11, the Ducks were unable to hold the momentum. They lost the next three 15-8, 15-7, 15-7.

The Duck offense could not come up with the big plays when they needed them. Cordova once again led Oregon with 12 kills and McNeel and White both had nine. The team had an attack percentage of .054 for the game, including negative numbers in the third and fourth games.

Sarah Silvernail led the Cougars with 15 kills and no hitting errors, and Karen Oigman had 10 kills.

The weekend losses dropped the Ducks to a 1-15 Pacific-10 Conference record and an 8-19 overall record. Although Oregon will finish the season in last place in the conference, the Ducks are still looking to better their 1-17 conference record from last season. They will get their last chance this week when California comes to McArthur Court on Thursday night and Stanford visits on Friday night.
