

Hockey: Snowcats start the season off with strong finish in first game

would best describe the action on the ice. With 10:13 remaining in the first period and one fight already cooled, Mexico City struck first with a goal by forward Igor Majesky. After receiving a pass from teammate Larry Bernard, Majesky skated in on the right side and put the puck past Eugene goalie Scott Humphrey with a backhanded shot to the top left corner of the goal.

However, the Snowcats didn't wait long to strike back and make the score even as assistant captain Darren Naylor scored the franchise's first-ever goal 34 seconds later. The forward scored, after splitting the Toreros' defense on a breakaway, with a shot that went in between goalie James Jensen's legs.

"It felt good to get [the franchise's first-ever goal] and get the season going," Naylor said. "It was big at the time."

Eugene scored again with 1:26 remaining in the period, as forward Bert Belvedere beat Jensen with a shot to the goal's top left corner making the score 2-1.

With less than a minute to go in the period another fight broke out, this time having major implications on the rest of the game. As one fight was being broken up, Mexico City defense-

man Link Gaetz went after Humphrey, who was standing in front of his goal watching the referees. Gaetz swung his stick at Humphrey, which caused a full line brawl — five fights at the same time. When things were settled, Gaetz and Humphrey were ejected from the game — Gaetz left with a bloody face.

"When they brought in Link Gaetz we were expecting this style of play," Dupas said.

Prior to the end of the period, Dupas replaced his ejected goalie with backup Eric Danielson, who allowed the Toreros to score with three seconds remaining to even the game again at 2-2.

The action on the ice was received by the fans in attendance with open hands.

"I'm impressed," said Jason Early, who moved here about six months ago from Seattle. "They move the puck pretty good. It's great that this city has something like this."

"It was great," Greg Hines, a senior in political science at the University, said of the brawl. "That's why a person comes to see a hockey game."

In the second and third periods the two teams stopped the bickering and played end-to-end hockey.

Midway through the second period, the Snowcats went on the offensive and opened a two-goal lead over the Toreros on a power-play goaled by team captain Don Gagne and a short-handed goal by defenseman and assistant player coach Kurt Walsten, who was assisted by Naylor on the play.

Danielson was solid at net for the Snowcats until the 9:49 mark when he gave up a rebound goal to Dusty McLellan and then a minute later allowed a weak wrist shot from the blue line by forward Peter Cox get by to tie the game 4-4.

Before the end of the period, Naylor notched his second goal of the game by faking the Toreros' goalie as he came across the goal from the left side. He was assisted by forward Kelly Hyrcun on the goal.

In the final period, the Snowcats put the Toreros to rest as they scored four goals while holding Mexico City to two goals late in the game. Naylor added another goal in the third period to score the hat trick and receive the first star award for the game.

The Snowcats beat the Toreros on Saturday 8-4, to end the two-game series. Their next home game will be on Nov. 24 at 7:30 p.m.
