## Search: A candlelight vigil will be held tonight at 5:30

after weather conditions prevented planes or helicopters to approach the North Sister where the two were believed to be located.

Waters said they were unable to get past the 8,000-foot elevation of the mountain.

"There is nobody to blame," she said. "Mother nature has stood in the way of getting to the top [of the North Sister]. It was meant to be by some higher power."

Miller speculated that the missing students suffered a climbing accident and fell into a crevasse they were unable to get out of. Because the two were skilled navigators, they would have otherwise found their way off the mountain, he said.

Miller said this was only one of many possible scenarios that could have happened.

Allard is an experienced outdoorsman who has gone on several hikes, said Jim Blanchard, director of the Outdoors Pursuits Program. Allard has taken several of the program's classes.

Casey was taking Blanchard's wilderness survival class this term.

According to The Oregonian, a group of Oregon Episcopal School students and teachers survived the winter elements at Mt. Hood in 1986. Approximately half of the 13 hikers sur-

vived living in a snow cave for three days.

Miller said the Mt. Hood case was different because, unlike current conditions in the Three Sisters, it was late enough in the season for a snow cave to be built.

A candlelight vigil is planned for the missing hikers at 5:30 p.m. today in the courtyard area between Gerlinger Hall and Knight Library. President Dave Frohnmayer will attend the vigil. Participants are being asked to bring their own candles.

Waters said she is happy there will be a vigil tonight.

"I think it's terrible to go through a loss of this kind," she said. "Some sort of exercise can assist in this grieving process, which this one does."

Miller said he was especially grateful for the assistance that was given in search efforts last week.

Help came from places such as the state Department of Transportation, which plowed the roads for the searchers' base camps. Portland and Corvallis search teams also helped look for the hikers, and Track Town Pizza and the University donated food to those involved in the effort.

"There was an immense amount of help and care," Miller said.

Influenza vaccinations will be given at the Student Health Center for faculty and staff every Wednesday, Thursday and Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and for students Monday - Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

**Students \$3.50  
Faculty and Staff \$4.00**

Annual flu immunizations are recommended for the following:

1. Healthy persons 65 years or older.
2. Persons with long-term heart or lung problems.
3. Persons with any of the following: kidney disease, cystic fibrosis, diabetes, anemia, severe asthma and conditions which compromise immune mechanism.

Influenza vaccine may be given to persons wishing to reduce their chances of catching the flu, persons who provide essential community services and students or others in schools or colleges.
