ensuing extra point attempt by kicker Herm Meister was blocked, proving to be costly for the Ducks at the game's end.

The Oregon State touchdown drive began with 5:43 to play in the game, when the Beavers took Doug Post's punt on the Oregon 41-yard line.

With the instructions from Oregon State head coach Tommy Prothro, quarterback Paul Brothers handed the ball to Booker Washington, Cliff Watkins and Charlie Shaw, while moving the offense toward the end zone. Shaw carried the ball 16 yards to the Ducks one-yard line before being hauled down.

The Beavers scored two plays later on a Washington carry with 54 seconds remaining in the game. Kicker Steve Clark added the go-ahead extra point to make the score 7-6.

The Ducks tried to utilize the time remaining the best they could to move into field goal range. Berry moved the offense to Oregon State's 38-yard line setting up a 55-yard field goal attempt for Post. His kick was straight but fell short of the crossbar.

After the game, the two head coaches — Prothro and Len Casanova — met on the field and shook hands, one victorious and one dejected.

# Eight years of frustration ends at Parker Stadium

## A GAME THAT WON'T BE FORGOTTEN

Oregon quarterback Dan Fouts and his offense took control of the game from the start with help from the team's defensive unit.

November 18, 1972

Oregon 30, Oregon State 3  
Parker Stadium

The 3-7 Ducks went to Parker Stadium with the idea that they were going to use their speed to defeat the hosting Beavers who were looking to stretch their winning streak over Oregon to nine games. The Ducks mission was accomplished.

On the opening offensive play of the game for the Ducks, quarterback Dan Fouts handed the ball off to Don Reynolds who burst up the middle on a trap play for a 60-yard scoring run.

Later in the quarter, kicker Hugh Woodward booted a 31-yard field goal to make the score 10-0 and begin the rout of Oregon State.

A 17-point second quarter followed for the Ducks. First, another Woodward field goal increased the lead to 13 points. Then, with the ball on the Oregon 35-yard line, Fouts went to his favorite deep route receiver, Greg Lindsey. Lindsey blew by Oregon State defender Wayne Letiner and caught Fouts' pass for a 65-yard touchdown reception, making the score 19-0.

By now the Beavers were playing plain ugly football. They fumbled the football eight times in the first half, with freshman quarterback Steve Gervais coughing it up the most. A blocked punt made it 27-3

at the half.

In the second half, the Oregon offense went sour, but it didn't matter because the Beavers were unable to sustain a drive against the Ducks defense.

After the game, the fans ripped apart the goal posts and delivered the remnants to the Oregon State bench for which they were unmercifully whaled upon by some of the disappointed Beavers.

In the locker room Oregon head coach Dick Enright talked about two people who weren't physically part of the Oregon victory. One was Alan Eustace, a promising defensive end the year before who for the time since had been battling illness which included the loss of a kidney. Eustace was with the team in the locker room following the victory clutching the game ball.

The other person was Jerry Frei, the former Oregon head coach.

In Enright's pocket was a telegram from Frei, then a Denver Bronco assistant. It read "Watching this one with my heart. May the Fighting Ducks own the state Saturday night."

What took eight years for the Ducks to accomplish came so easily for them on a rainy day in Corvallis.
