They did it. After narrowly beating intrastate rival Oregon State 12-10 on Saturday, the Oregon football team officially clinched a berth in the Cotton Bowl in Dallas, Texas, on Jan. 1.

The Cotton Bowl invitation marks only the second time in Oregon history when the Ducks have qualified for Bowl games in successive years and the first time any Oregon football team has ever gone to back-to-back New Year's Day Bowl games.

The Ducks went to the Independence Bowl in 1989 and then to the Freedom Bowl in 1990, but head coach Mike Bellotti said that this year has bigger implications than years past.

"I think it is a tremendous accomplishment," Bellotti said, "and I think it puts Oregon football where it ought to be: in back-to-back Jan. 1 Bowl games, and at a level of national prominence that we have aspired to be at."

"It obviously puts us in a situation where we have some positive pressure on ourselves to maintain and continue [at this level]."

The Cotton Bowl gives the Ducks what seems to be the second-best post-season appearance available to Oregon, as USC has already clinched the Rose Bowl. It is played in the Cotton Bowl, which seats over 68,000 people,

## Paulus will speak on campus

■ **PAULUS:** Senate candidate wants to downsize federal government

Norma Paulus, a Republican candidate running for the vacated seat of former Sen. Bob Packwood, wants to downsize the federal government to return more control and responsibility to the state in all areas.

Oregon has already set a good example for the rest of the country by managing its own budgets and programs, Paulus said.

"I welcome [the downsizing] because Oregon has already demonstrated time and time again that it can do a better job managing its affairs in the federal government," she said. "Just look at our land-use laws,

our beaches, our education system, our health plan and our welfare system with the jobs plus program, to name a few."
