EMU MICROBREW PUB

Wouldn't it be nice to have a place where you could sit back and enjoy a microbrew in a mellow, relaxing atmosphere? Imagine being able to socialize without the intimidation of drunk and rowdy people; hanging out where socialization, not intoxication is the norm. Welcome to the EMU Microbrew Pub.

In response to growing student concerns about the safety of bars, the ASUO has begun preliminary research on the possibility of a pub in the EMU. The proposed EMU Pub would offer university students a safer alternative to other drinking establishments in the area.

"We are offering students a choice which they did not have before. A choice of socialization rather than intoxication," said Zachary Kelton, ASUO Vice-President.

The need for a safe alternative is well-documented. Studies show a high-correlation between intoxication and assaults. Many students enjoy the social atmosphere of pubs, but fear the related problems.

"It is this fear that we want to address," said Kelton. "All students want to have fun without worrying about possible dangerous situations."

In order to promote the safety of the pub, ASUO has come up with several ways to ensure that the atmosphere is fun, relaxing and safe environment for students. No hard alcohol will be served, and there will be limits on the amount of beer each customer will be allowed to consume. No one will be served who is visibly intoxicated.

ASUO is also making several efforts to promote responsible drinking. Two pieces of identification will be required to enter to help counter underage drinking. Plus, ASUO is working with the Designated Driver Shuttle to establish shuttle service for students.

"We need to stress the idea that when people choose to drink, they need to drink responsibly," said Kelton. He noted that all the student profits from the proposed pub will go to promoting responsible drinking and alcohol awareness or responsible drinking programs.
