

Ducks continue success in Hawaii

■ **TENNIS:** Both the men's and women's teams won their first matches in the Hawaii tournament

Both Oregon's tennis teams went into Hawaii on Monday night and grabbed victories, keeping the two squads undefeated in the young 1995-96 tennis season.

The women's 6-3 defeat over Hawaii got the Ducks off to a 1-0 start. The match was the first of four that the Ducks will play on their road trip to Hawaii.

Team captain Elise Adams defeated Amy Kusch 6-4, 4-6, 6-2 in singles play. Other singles winners were freshmen Ali Napier and Shanelle Kaneshiro. Napier beat Salami Lesa in

straight sets 6-4, 6-3. Kaneshiro made her homecoming successful by also winning in straight sets over Nataili Lum 6-4, 6-3. The Ducks other winner, Jaime Martin, also won in straight sets.

Oregon's Caryn Coyle and Allison Sosnow were both defeated.

The Duck's doubles teams almost had a sweep with the teams of Adams and Sosnow and Kaneshiro and Napier both winning 8-6.

On the men's side, the Ducks pushed their overall season record to 3-0 with a win over Hawaii. Oregon won three out of five singles matches and two out of three doubles to secure a team win.

Duck team captain Dougal Williams lost to the number one

Rainbow player, Alex Sugai, in straight sets, 4-6, 4-6. Oregon rallied to win the next match with Hans Forsberg's solid victory over Kula Oda 7-5, 6-4. Hawaii's Keith Wyre then went on to get the final Rainbows' final win of the day with a 7-6, 2-6, 6-2 victory over John Devross. Carlos Navarro, Jeff String and Miguel Arriaga won the final three singles matches to seal the Oregon team victory.

In doubles competition, duo Forsberg and Williams beat out Hawaii's Oda and Simon 8-4, while the Ducks' Goldstein and Devross defeated Sugai and Michael Trutor to round out the Oregon scoring contingent. Navarro and Williams lost in the final doubles match of the day for the Ducks, 2-5.

Baylor faces lawsuit after benching athlete

HOUSTON (AP) — Former Baylor basketball player Tyrone Davis is suing the school for making him sit out a year while Southwest Conference officials scrutinized his academic record, the Houston Chronicle reported Tuesday.

In the suit filed in Kansas City on Monday, Davis charges that the actions of the school's coaches and administrators defrauded him and caused him emotional distress.

The suit mentions no specific damages.

Baylor and eight individuals are named in the suit, including

former Baylor basketball coach Darrel Johnson, former university president Herbert Reynolds and former football coach and athletic director Grant Teaff.

The other defendants are Johnson's three assistants during the 1993-94 season — Gary Thomas, Kevin Gray and Troy Drummond — and Vinson Metcalf, a Hill College coach who acted as the proctor for three correspondence-course exams Davis took.

"Tyrone gave up a year of his life," his attorney Scott Mach said. "If there's an innocent victim in all this, it's Tyrone."

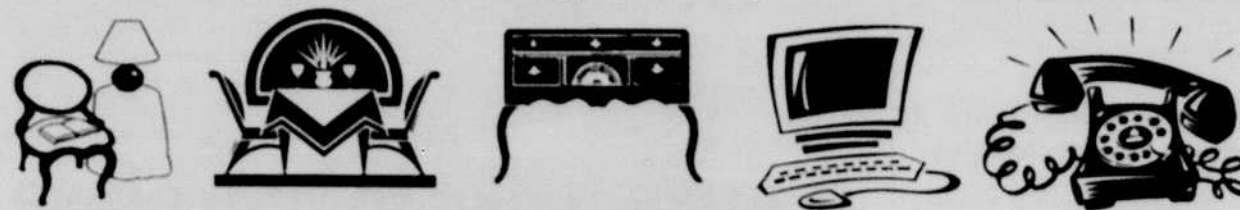
